



PLAYER PROFILE DARREN LEE

Born in the Rhondda Valley, South Wales, Darren started playing soccer at the age of 9. He started his playing career with Ynyshire Boys Club and after one season was selected to for the Rhondda school boys. In 1982 he was selected as clubman of the year. Later that year he emigrated to Australia with his family and joined Skye Rovers Soccer Club as it was then known. After three years in the juniors Darren started playing senior soccer for the club at 15. His early baptism was to play for Skye in the Bayside League competition (a toughening up process). He was then a member of the clubs inaugaral team in the Provisional League. In 1986 Darren left us to further his soccer career with near neighbours Seaford and after one season had won a league championship trophy and a Provisional League cup winners medal. In the next season Darren won the clubs Best and Fairest award. In the same year he was selected for the State youth team to go to Perth for the National championships but injury caused him to pull out. Darren then spent a season at Chelsea where he again won another League medal. After one season he returned to Seaford and besides playing coached a junior team which he had also done at Skye. This year sees Darren return to Frankston where he hopes he can have the same success. A footnote to this last remark is that it is nice to get an ex-player back to the fold and we are certain Darren will contribute much to the team this season.
