STRIKERS PENALTY WOES

Frankston Strikers went down 0-4 to local rivals Langwarrin at the weekend in a disappointing game dominated in the main by the final losers.

Strikers had a nightmare start, giving away a penalty goal in the first minute, but they recovered quickly and soon had control of the game. The back line were solid dealing easily with the Langwarrin forwards, and the midfield mounted continual attacks on the opposition goal, but a ball hit off the lined, and many near misses denied them getting the much deserved equaliser. Right on half time disaster struck the Strikers again with keeper Sivuja being sent off and Langwarrin getting a second goal from the penalty goal.

Kicking off the second half with ten men, Strikers shook off the earlier mishaps and took charge of the game again. For nearly 30 minutes their substitute keeper was rarely tested, but up front the lack of strike power, a problem that's been dogging the Strikers this season, just wouldn't bring the much needed goals. In the dying minutes of the game, a couple of mistakes let Langwarrin slipped in two more quick goals to give them their flattering final score line.

The top of the league Reserves continued their great run with a convincing 2-1 win over Langwarrin in a game they controlled for most of the 90 minutes.

They started the game with a lot resolve and determination, not allowing the Morwell forwards a look in.
