## SOUTHERN SNAPSHOTS

**A**FTER some interesting Easter matches no dominant team has emerged in First Division South soccer as 9 teams gained points.

Key matches this Saturday will be at Frankston and Preston with 2 upsets possible.

Frankston have some promising young players and Austria some ball players who are easily rattled. Home ground advantage may give Frankston the points over a Austria suffering a reaction from their Preston clash.

One of the season's surprises may be at Preston where a determined Sandringham City will remember they held Preston to a close 2-3 result in a 1960 practice match. Both sides have improved considerably but Preston have not won decisively against Brighton and Dandenong as expected. The tight Sandringham defence could at least ensure a draw and, with more method in attack, Sandringham could win narrowly.

Geelong have lost much of 1960's punch and only good form by their goalie and centre-forward kept them in the game at Yallourn. Fern-tree Gully have not shown convincing form yet but have some potential — especially their outside right. So with 2 teambuilding teams a draw is possible.

Dandenong have had record training numbers—up to 45—and enthusiasm is very high after their Preston form. Yallourn won twice last season but their visitors have the current form—and take their chances better.

**Brighton have the job ahead and their experience should be too much for a promising South Yarra.**

The surprise team of the Second Division is Flinders Naval Depot who have won well at Rosebud and Moorabbin. Thus their visit to Macedonia should provide some hard, fast and attractive soccer.

## Brighton favoured

Interesting games at Dandenong, Preston and Fern-tree Gully highlight another crucial First Division South round. Can challengers Brighton, Dandenong and Austria narrow Preston's early superiority?

In the relegation field, 3 current candidates Geelong, South Yarra and Frankston, travel to face strong opposition and points will be hotly contested

The Dandenong - Brighton game will be a triller and defences will be the key. Dandenong won 5-2 in a 1960 upset but Brighton have the confidence and form to win narrowly.

Promising Yallourn spearhead Nees, a hat-trick artist against Dandenong, faces strong Croatian opposition from Pomohoc, Forago and goalie Djukic at Preston. This support from McClean and...

strong defences. The confident Preston forwards led by Mikuleic, however should beat Blunt enough to score another convincing Preston win.

Austria have won well against Frankston and Yallourn and must be strongly favoured against struggling Geelong. The strong Austrian half-back Kaper, Rabel and Jungwirth should dominate and the visiting forwards led by secretary Stirman will need greater accuracy to worry goalie Mayer. Geelong are rebuilding with an English team and face niggled opposition.

The promoted Fern-tree Gully and Frankston teams meet in a crucial game and Gully must be favoured with better forwards and more system than the niggled visitors. Frankston's 1961 recruits led by Italian pivot Fall and new coach Stanley have greatly strengthened the Seaside but their forwards lack method and that will be fatal against Gully's clever de-

# TOUGH GAME FOR GEELONG

Today sees the end of the most interesting first round in First Division South for many seasons. Preston, Austria, Brighton and Yallourn have become form teams as predicted on April 1.

Key matches are at Sandringham and Fernree Gully while a disappointing Dandenong could redeem at Austria.

Relegation stakes feature a crucial match at Frankston while Geelong have a tough visit to Preston.

Sandringham is an off-shot of Brighton and meeting usually produce attractive "derbies". Sandy led easy in 1960 but Brighton took points 4-2 and are the form team again. Unlucky against Gully, the Brighton team is their strongest for years and lacks only accurate scorers to capitalise fine apfield teamwork. Dandenong are in a slump and face trouble at Austria. The home team has strong reserves and there is no reason why Austria shouldn't use to State League within 3 seasons. Geelong worried both teams badly recently and the fast Dandenong team realise that this is a crucial game. Greater incentive, to keep out of relegation zone, should give Dandenong a surprise win for President Mayer & Co.

Geelong are moulding into a promising team but may lack sufficient good forwards to worry the Croatsians at Collier Street. Preston are the form team and they realise that even lower teams could be hard opposition during relegation worries.

**BIG CLASH IN SOUTH**
