FRANKSTON HAVE SO MANY CHILDREN — THEY DON'T KNOW WHAT TO DO ... !

Frankston has so many juniors — 120 all told — that it has had to close its lists for the time being.

But Frankston Shire Council is coming to the rescue and is constructing a new "Soccer Centre" with at least three pitches and clubrooms.

"This will ease the pressure and give us more grounds to play on," secretary Ern Loveday, a former London Football Association Youth Selector, said this week.

Ern said that Frankston had many promising juniors — and the club had a

five-year plan to be in State League.

This is remarkable progress in such a short time. Frankston was formed only three years ago with one team. Now they are fielding 11 teams.

An Under-18 team was entered in the southern section, but because of heavy commitments to the reserves, the team handed over its fixtures to a young team from Mornington.

Later the Under-18's

came back in the Eastern section and played four games, retiring undefeated.

The Under-16 and Under-14 teams finished runners-up in their sections, and the Under-12 ran a close third to South Melbourne-Hellas and Wilhelmina, and are also in the Cup semi-final.

Frankston has many promising juniors — 11 have won representative honors to date and have been chased by State League clubs.

One youngster, John Butterfield, is claimed by club officials to be the best ball player in Victoria. He was a former Manchester schoolboy and England Youth trialist — but he has not yet come

under the eye of Victorian Under-16 selectors.

Greg Warren, Under-16 captain, and Australian born, has a great future as a right-back.

Michael Mail, outstanding in the Under-14 group, is an automatic choice for Victoria.

Paul Clayton, aged 9, is believed to be the youngest boy to win representative honors in the Under-12 group.

Billy Papousakis and Geoff Bardsley are both Metropolitan XI goalkeepers, and come from the Under-14 and Under-12 respectively.

Frankston has 12 junior committee members, headed by chairman Don Stone.

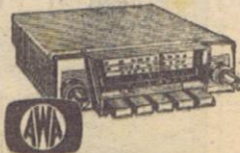
