SECOND DIVISION

Yallourn maintained their unbeaten home record when they defeated Frankston City 2-0 in a tough and hard game.

The country side had the edge on Frankston all day and, showing great system and teamwork, they held a goal lead at half-time.

Midway through the second half Frankston centre forward, John Walton, suffered a broken leg when he crashed with the Yallourn goalkeeper in a race for the ball. the week before in which considering their hard game injuries were suffered by several key players.

However, City strengthened their defence with the signing from Triestina of experienced full - back George Eadie.

Dave Morgan put Frankston ahead after half an hour from a penalty kick after Richmond link man Rolf Beinroth had handled.
