OUR VISITORS

Close friends, but extreme rivals: Such are our visitors today, Altona Soccer Club.

Founded as Williamstown United Soccer Club, Altona took its title in February 1965. At a special meeting, members believed a change of name would be beneficial for two reasons: (1) that the progressive Council in Altona would give more support to soccer, and (2) that more supporters would follow the club. Happily, both reasons were correct and today the present Shire President, Cr. G.S. McIntosh, is a staunch supporter of the club.

The club has an able committee. The President is Mr. L.C. Noordenne who has fostered a cup competition for clubs in the Western Suburbs. Vice President is Mr. John Mather, and to complete the members, Bill Blenkhorn is Treasurer, John Collins Junior Official, James Todd and the Secretary Joe Nespor, who incidentally was best clubman for 1966.

Jimmy Balisch, ex Sunshine City player, is now the Club's coach, taking over from Mario Greco. The club's recent signing of Keith van de Poel from J.U.S.T. has also greatly strengthened the team.

THE VISIT OF MANCHESTER UNITED

It is the pleasure of the soccer playing fraternity of Australia to welcome the famous English league club Manchester United to our shores. They will play two games in Victoria, one of which is tomorrow afternoon against Victoria, the other is against a State League XI on Wednesday, June 21st, at 8 o'clock. Both matches are at Olympic Park.

Today, Manchester United is one of the greatest and wealthiest soccer clubs in the world, enjoying fame and respect wherever football is played. Under the inspiring leadership of Matt Busby, Manchester United have won several league titles and cup finals and have been within an ace of a European Cup Final. The season just concluded in U.K. has once again made them league champions, and makes them one of the most consistent teams in the first division.

Many great players have donned the famous red and white strip. Undoubtedly, the pre Munich team of 1957 will rank as one of the finest to represent the club. Nobody could have foretold the greatness of Duncan Edwards or Eddie Colman. What a misfortune, not only to the club but to the British Isles, that so many talented players were lost to the game.

It is interesting to recall the words of the late H.P. Hardman, United's Chairman in 1958, when he wrote: 'Although we mourn our dead and grieve for our wounded, we believe that great days are not done for us. The sympathy and encouragement of the football world, and particularly of our supporters, will justify and inspire us. The road back may be a long and hard one, but with the memory of those who died at Munich, of their stirring achievements and wonderful sportsmanship ever with us, Manchester United will rise again.'

The tour team contains nine full internationals: Bobby Charlton, Nobby Stiles and Bill Foulkes of England; Denis Law, Pat Crerand, Scotland; George Best, Northern Ireland; Seamus Brennan, Tony Dunne and Noel Cantwell, Eire. Alex Stepney, David Sadler, John Aston (first teamers), Jimmy Ryan, John Fitzpatrick, John Rimmer, Francis Burns, Paul Edwards, form the rest of the party.

"THE REFEREE" REPLIES

- QUESTION (I) Answer: Because the ball has not been "intentionally" handled by the player. It must be borne in mind that the Referee is the "Sole" judge of intent.
- QUESTION (II) Answer: A player is offside if he is nearer his opponents' goal-line than the ball at the moment the ball is played, unless :-
 - He is in his own half of the field of play;
 - (b) There are two of his opponents nearer their own goalline than he is;
 The ball last touched an opponent or was played by him;
 - - He receives the ball direct from :(i) Goal kick; (ii) Corner kick; (iii) Throw in; (iv) When dropped by the Referee.

You are invited to ask the Referee a question, which will be answered in this corner.
