THE REFEREE REPLIES

Answer 1 - It is the linesman's job to indicate to the referee that something is wrong, or an infringement has taken place. In this case, a player is in an offside position, However, it is the referee's sole responsibility to decide whether or not the player is interfering with play, or seeking to gain an advantage.

Moral - Do not abuse your own club linesman, or maybe the opposing team's linesman, he is only carrying out the instructions of the referee.

Answer 11 - Award a penalty kick. The game was stopped as soon as the referee blew his whistle for the handling offence.

SOCCER TOPIC - A case for increasing the leagues. This year, as in the past, one team will be relegated from State League to Div.1. Likewise, one will rise from Div.1. Is it time we increased the State League to fourteen teams, and adopted a two up, two down system? Perhaps we could also increase the leagues down to Div.4 too. The reason for saying this is that the same clubs are involved each year, be it Alexander, Makedonia or Wilhelmina. Obviously all three are State League Clubs rather than Div.1 sides. The increase would therefore give other clubs the chance to go "big". St. Albans have been on the threshold for two years now, yet it seems certain they will stay down this year because only one club rises. The cost of being a State League member is enormous. This could be compensated by the higher crowds the club will obviously get. As a result of the increase in the State League clubs, this must have an effect on all other leagues, yet this can only be for the good. Looking at all the present league tables, it is obvious that there are many clubs very equal, yet some will stay down this season.
