Supporters who witnessed last week's game at Park Rangers must be hoping for a repeat performance today. The first half opened with us playing good football, but producing no goals. It came as quite a shock to see a breakaway move ending with a twenty yard drive finishing in our net. Our equaliser was quick to follow, Jimmy Lindsay heading a beautiful goal from a corner kick.

To fill in the second half details, Garry Padgett gave us the lead with a well floated chip shot over the goal-keeper's head. An identical goal was scored by Martin Leenstra some ten minutes later; with us really flying now, a cross from a Jimmy Lindsay free kick was helped home by Kurt Schroeder. Our final goal was a magnificent thirty yard drive from Gerry Pask, after good work by Trevor Parry. Two late goals spoiled our goal average and brought Rangers some consolation.

The Reserves gave a very disappointing display in losing 2 - 1. Showing no cohesion in either half, they were deservedly beaten. Henk Brouer scored our only goal.

The second round of the Dockerty Cup has brought a favourable draw to the firsts. We play at home to Carlton Olympic, the fourth division outfit. The Reserves drew State Leaguers Melbourne at home in the Armstrong Cup. Dates have yet to be announced.
