### CITY CHATTER

Last Saturday, we recorded our third successive away defeat and perhaps stopped any ideas of promotion to Division One this season.

The game was highlighted by a magnificent performance in goal by Billy Papousakio who literally stopped everything that was thrown at him. Three penalties were missed one by us, two by Albion. The scoreline of 1-0 might be taken as a close game, however our forwards never looked like scoring and we were perhaps quite lucky to get off so lightly. The draw for the second round of the Dockerty Cup was announced last week and we have drawn ourselves a plum fixture. Our opponents will be Dandenong City currently leading the first division and we will be playing them away at a date to be announced.

What could be described as our blackest season as regarding to players being sent off for misconduct was really drummed home with the suspension of Ron Cummings for eight weeks, this virtually means an early end to the season for this player. Brian Woodgate, Brian Finch and Mike Bevis must have counted their blessings that they got off with only a week's suspension between them.

We take this opportunity to welcome Frank Thompson to the club, he was signed from Sandringham two weeks ago and was baptised into the first team last week, it was to be an unhappy birthday for Frank as he failed to find the net from our penalty. It was left to our third team to redeem some of our lost honour over the weekend, playing away to Brighton they defeated the home side by six goals to two. We now hold a position just over half-way.

Parading a vastly improved side to that which visited us earlier in the season ALBION quickly settled into the game and made several early raids on our goal. Their two inside forwards were beginning to prove most troublesome and both had the ability to slow the game down and push defence. In one such move the ball was crossed from the wing both Billy Papousakis and their centre forward went up for the ball, it proved a dangerous cross, Billy hustled in attempting to catch the ball, dropped it and their centre was given the easiest of chances to put ALBION one up.

Not dismayed by this goal we continued to try and force our way into the game, however, ALBION continued to hold the aces and on two occasions their inside left missed the easiest of chances to increase their lead. In one of our rare attacks Graham Baulk was brought down in the area, however, we failed to equalise from the resultant penalty. The second half was to prove to be ALBIONS, running well off the ball and using the open spaces, our defence became hard pressed to stop further goals. Billy Papousakis bringing off many top class scores: - this hectic period ALBION were to miss two good chances of increasing their lead. Nigel Bens and Tony Hall giving away penalties in defence of their goal. Billy was equal to the occasion and saved both shots. At the other end we could record only one good shot at their goal and this is in itself and indication of just how much ALBION had the game wrapped up. It seems obvious that if we want to have a chance of going up our forwards will have to show some past form and score goals.
