It has been some years since our Frankston Club has won a league title. The 1st XI have been close to Promotion every year for the past four, but the Reserve XI have been edged out of the top spot in all but one of the last four years. We have had the players to cope with an extensive league programme and to cover the first team requirements but, let us not take away the supreme effort of our second string especially in games, they have come from behind to win or gain a point. Howard Dixon, flown from Sydney last week, even though he has had a very capable defence in front of him. All in all a pleasing season and well rewarded. All players can take a bow and feel they have earned what they've achieved.

SEASON 1970 SUMMARY

In contrast to the previous two seasons we started this one quite well and kept up the challenge from the start.
