CLUBMAN'S CORNER No. 3 STANLEY NORMAN STANLEY The name above is correct. Norm, as we know him said it was the only time in his life he was speechless, so the name stands, or should I say stans. Norm Stanley was born in Freshwater, Isle of Wight, but moved to Welwyn Garden City at the age of 3. His next door neighbour at that tender age was Horace Baulk. Quite fantastic that they should both end up at the same club in Aust. Norm was 17 years old when the 2nd World War broke out in 1939. He joined the Territorials and served his Country in the Middle East, Italy and France, where he was one of the many evacuated at Dunkirk. Norman served in the Royal Artillery on Radar and reached the dizzy heights of Staff Sergeant (hence the booming voice?). During his military career, he had the fortune to be billeted in Ticknall, Derby in private digs. A young lady named Dawn lived next door, yes - that's new wife Dawn, also a prominent member of the Frankston Club. They have a daughter Ann who is married to first teamer Trever Parry and who recently became a Mother of a daughter, Sian. Norm and Dawn came to Australia in 1957. Norm now works as a Judges Tipstaff in the Supreme Court of Victoria. Before this he managed the local Riviera Hotel at Seaford. In his playing career, Norm played for Arsenal Reserves and was on the books of the double Champions for 7 years. As an Amateur he played for Hitchin Town and Nebworth, John Walton S! old club. Norm represented the British Army against Italy at Rimini in 1945 as a centre half. His professional career ended at Luton when he broke his leg, in the same game Jesse Pye, later of Wolves and England broke an ankle. In Australia, Norm played for Frankston in 1961 at the age of 40 years. He has occupied every post in the Club, and was the first Frankston member to be elected on the Metro League Management Committee. He later became Chairman and was elected to the Victorian Executive Committee. Norm is also a proficient Darts. player and Spin Bowler. He has had a happy year this year with Frankston winning promotion, Arsenal, of whom he is an ardent supporter, winning the double, and becoming a Grandfather a month or so ago. Now says Norm, he wants to see Frankston in the National League. Arsenal win the World Club Championship, to become a Great Grandfather and for somebody to agree with him.
