Our own David High originally with Reading, was also there. We look forward to what I believe is the first contest between our Clubs and with our expected improvement about due, this could prove an interesting battle.

We showed some improvement last week with the inclusion of Dave High and Jim Adam against a strong Sunshine side and had Alan Parrott, back after injury, not gone off late in the second half with a reoccurrence of that injury, we may have been better off. In fact, Alan had a couple of chances in the second half with the hamstring injury slowing him at the vital moment. Two chances from Dave Johnstone also, may have done the trick also, but that's football. We look forward however, to a much improved second half of the season and momentarily a win today against Czech side Slavia. Behind the scenes, Behind the scenes, Duncan Mackay of Croatia and former Scottish International may well be playing in a Frankston shirt shortly. Whilst gaining experienced players in the last few weeks, this will not be the club's policy in the future.
