Report:

WHAT COMES NEXT ?

The World Cup in 1970 was won by Brazil who had shown tremendous flair in attacking football, beating the more regimented, disciplined defensive games of Italy, Mexico. Uraguay, England and West Germany. So it seems that the Jules Rimet Trophy was won by the best attackers and not the best defenders. The Mexican Soccer Fiesta indicated that when 2 sides are well matched, attack may well prove to be the best form of defence. Can it be that Brazil's triumph could start a new world-wide upsurge in attacking football? It is quite common these days to see full backs and centre halves among the goals. So then is it a possibility that we may soon see scores like 6-5 or 7-3 as was the much remembered Real Madrid - Eintracht European Cup Final - rather than the recent trend of 0-0 or 1-0? There could be no dramatic change. In the long drawn out campaigns of National Leagues and European tournaments played in mud, slush and sunshine, no responsible Manager or Coach could readily encourage his men to imitate the cavalier approach of the Brazilians. With forwards like Rele, Jaidzinko, Tostao and Revelino, the world champions were for the present, unimitable. Yet the 1970 World Cup did emphasise the value of encouraging players to improve their individual talent and not style their inventiveness completely for the sake of mechanical teamwork. Sport never stands still. Over the years the evolution of the game has been as dramatically progressive as our species from Apes to Astronauts. The game with sweepers, centre backs, strikers, and linkmen is almost unrecognisable as the primitive pastime of yesteryears. Who can then say if the game will not change further and approach the ultimate. We may see teams emerging with the individual flair of the Brazilians, the authority of England and the indestructable spirit of the Germans, in adversity. So then - What does come next?

PERSONALITY PARADE No. 5 ALAN JONES

Our fifth personality Parade this season features one of our younger playing members - Alan Jones. Long, blonde haired Alan was born in Macclesfield and migrated to Australia with his family in 1969.
