All players apparently are being prepared for the 1974 World Cup and all are under 23 Internationals.

In the game I remember most, the same thing might have happened. I was playing outside left for Sutton United and this was the game I was really looking forward to, away to Hendon, the top Amateur side in England. Our left back was taken ill before the kick off and our Manager in his wisdom, decided to switch me to left back, where I found myself marking Terry Howard, the current England Amateur International winger. Hendon scored in the first minute and we equalised just before half time. With the game 5 minutes from the end, I had managed to keep Howard quiet, not always by fair means. I overlapped in true Cooper style and the winning goal was scored from my centre. Did this herald a new career at full back? Not on your life. The following week I was back on the left wing and with various clubs since Sutton United, I have usually found myself playing on the wing, including Frankston, where I find myself wearing the No.7 shirt.....
