In Rosyth, John was a Draftsman with the Admiralty and now works as a Senior Technical Officer in the Flinders Naval Depot. John met his wife Ethel in the Admiralty office in Rosyth they were married in 1948. They have 2 daughters - Glenny's and Beryl and a Son Jeffrey. Glennys is married to a Hastings footballer and John and Ethel are Grandparents of Shaun, 14 months. John Barclay was elected on to the VSF Board of Management in 1961 and has been a Member ever since.
