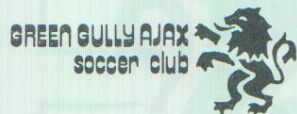

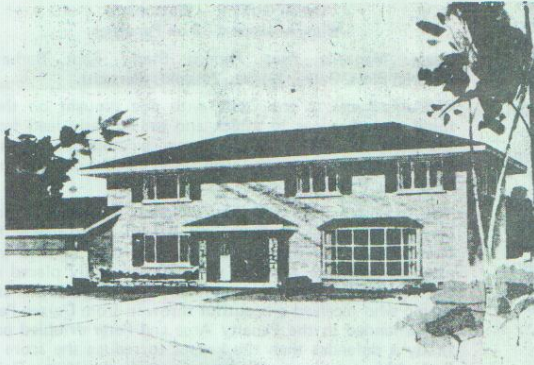
"But we can still win to maintain our climb up the league table.

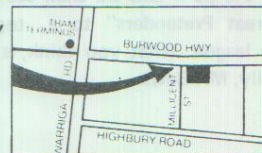

For the benefit of our supporters who are not yet members of our Club or for our members who may not have received them, we reproduce the new Rules pertaining to the Liquor Licence.

RULES AND CONDITIONS PERTAINING TO LIQUOR LICENCE

1. The Club is for MEMBERS only.
2. MEMBERS MUST PRODUCE THEIR MEMBERSHIP CARD ON REQUEST.
3. MEMBERS are allowed to bring into the club no more than four guests at any one time.
4. Members are responsible for their guests behaviour.
5. Any member who:
 - i. wilfully refuses to comply with any rules of the Club.
 - ii. behaves in the Club's premises in a violent, disorderly, abusive or offensive manner;
 - iii. is guilty of conduct whether in the Club premises or elsewhere, which in the opinion of the committee is injurious to the interests, welfare or reputation of the Club, or unbecoming of a member of the Club –
The Member shall be liable to be censured, fined, suspended or expelled from the Club by the Committee.
6. Any member of the Committee who witnesses any Member behaving on the club premises in a violent, disorderly, abusive or offensive manner has the power to order the offending Member to leave the Club premises forthwith for the duration of the day.
7. Liquor can only be consumed on the Club premises during the specified times of the licence.

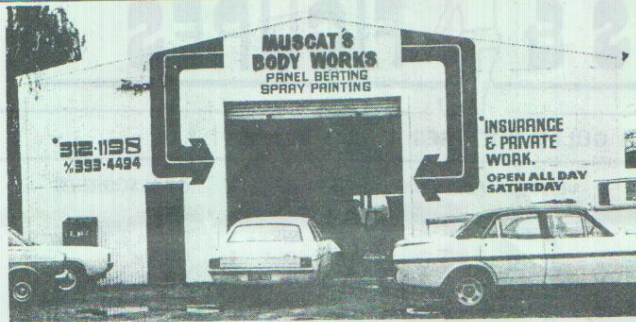
