After talking last week of two well established players, we turn now to two player just starting on their senior careers, and we hope they will be a part of Frankston City for years to come. As it is with these types of boys we hope to build for the future of the Club.

Sean Parton - Sean came to Australia with his parents in 1970 and played with Springvale for five years coming up through the junior ranks. He then moved to Slavia and played in the Colts and Reserve sides. Sean is in his second year at Frankston and is currently playing at left back. He has had an illustrious representative career to date. In 1976 he played for Victoria at under 15 level in the National Championships where they finished runner-ups and in 1979 he again

played in the National Championships at under 18 level when Victoria won the title. Sean is now in the Victorian Youth Squad and will travel to Canberra in May, yet again for the National Championships.

David Gilbert - Goalkeeper - David is also a boy with a big future in the game and also has a swag of honours to date. He started playing with Seafords under 8 and made his Victorian debut at 10 years of age. He then went on to the remarkable record of representing Victoria at every age level from 10 to 18. David achieved his highest honour yet last year when he played for Australia under 16 in Singapore in the Lions Cup, where they were beaten in the final by Iraq. On top of all this he then flew off to England for 7 weeks intensive training with Norwich City in the English First Division. A trip financed by Mr. Ian Gray, a member of our Club. David will also represent Victoria along with Sean in Canberra in May, and it is from these Championships that Rudi Gutendorf will select his Australian Squad for the World Youth Tournament to be held next year. So we wish both these boys the best of luck in Canberra from a very pleased and proud Club.
