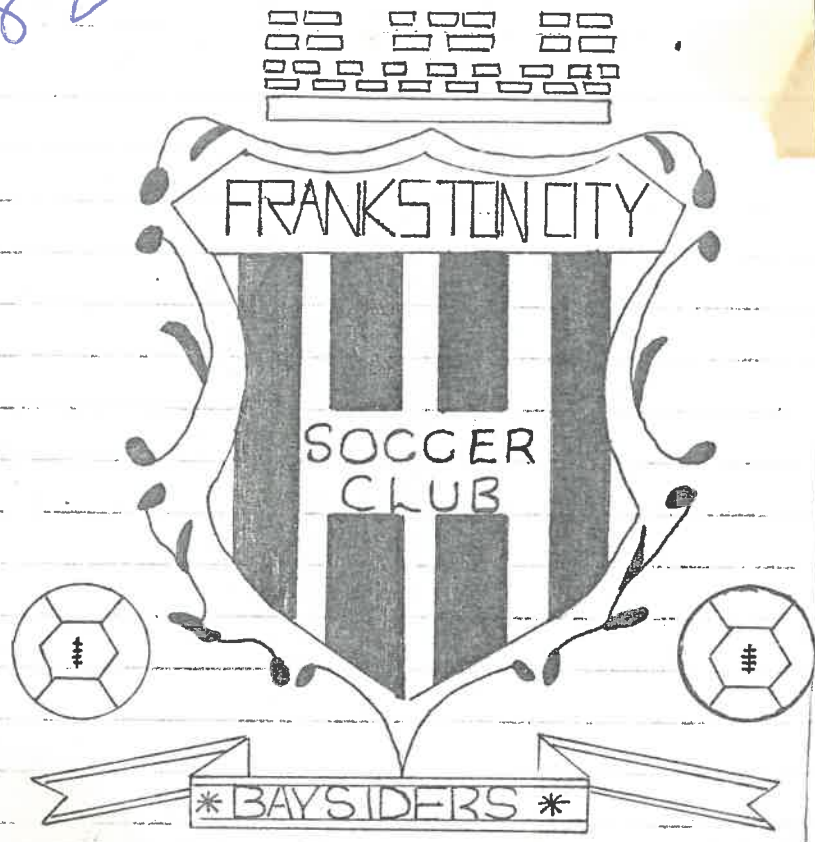

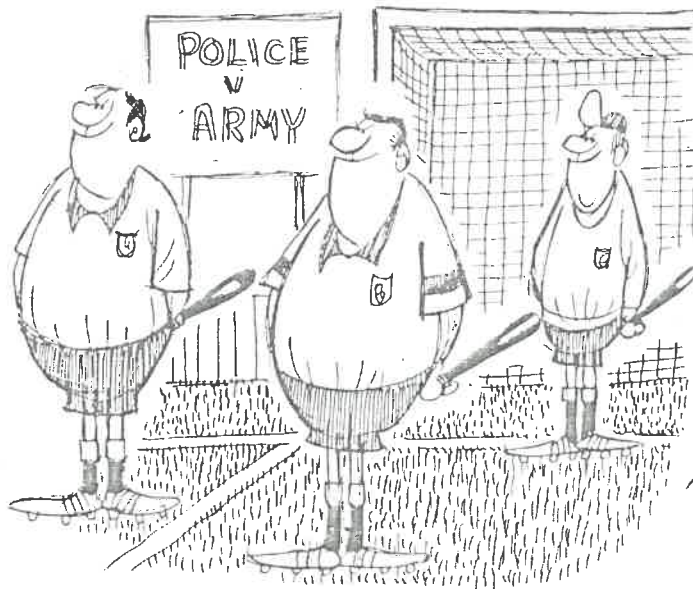

FRANKSTON TRAVELLED TO EGANLEE RESERVE, WANTIRNA SOUTH IN SEARCH OF TWO POINTS AGAINST MIDTABLE KNOX CITY. THE TALE OF THE TWO CITIES WAS DOMINATED FRANKSTON, WHO SKAMMED IN EIGHT GOALS WITHOUT REPLY.

CITY STARTED THE MATCH WITHOUT THEIR REGULAR LEFTBACK MARK WALLACE WHO WAS OUT WITH INFLUENZA SO JUSTIN MORRIS FILLED IN AT FULLBACK AND STUART DEGOEDE FOUND HIMSELF BACK ON THE FORWARD LINE.

FRANKSTON BEGAN THE ROUT IN THE FIFTH MINUTE WHEN DARREN ARMITAGE WENT DOWN THE RIGHT TO THE BYELINE AND CUT THE BALL BACK TO THE EVER ALERT STEVEN CLARKE WHO TAPPED THE BALL INTO THE EMPTY NET UNCHALLENGED.

THE SECOND CAME WHEN DEGOEDE PLAYED A BALL THROUGH TO JASON SYMONDS WHO RAN INTO THE BOX AND SQUARED THE BALL TO THE UNMARKED CLARKE WHO SHOT, ONLY TO SEE THE KEEPER BLOCK THE BALL TO DEGOEDE WHO SLAMMED HOME THE REBOUND.

CITY'S THIRD CAME WHEN MARK DOE PUMPED A LONG BALL THROUGH THE MIDDLE FOR SYMONDS TO CHASE, WHO LATCHED ON TO IT AND SIMPLY SLOTTED THE BALL PAST THE DESPAIRING KEEPER AND INTO A UGLY NET.

JUST ON HALF-TIME CITY ADDED ANOTHER WHEN THE HARDWORKING DEGOEDE PEAKED ANOTHER THROUGH BALL TO SYMONDS, WHO AGAIN GOT ON THE END OF IT AND AFTER A SERIES OF LUCKY RICOCHETS AGAINST THE KEEPER AND LAST DEFENDER FOUND HIMSELF WITH AN EMPTY NET AT HIS MERCY WHICH HE GLADLY OBLIGED BY SIMPLY SLOTTING THE BALL OVER THE LINE TO MAKE IT 4-0.

THE FIFTH CAME TEN MINUTES INTO THE SECOND HALF WHEN DEGOEDE SCORED HIS SECOND FOR THE AFTERNOON BY SLOTTING THE BALL PAST THE HADLESS KNOX CUSTODIAN. WITH FIVE GOALS SEEMINGLY BEING FRANKSTON'S LOT, CITY HAMMERED IN THREE GOALS IN THE LAST FIVE MINUTES WITH GOALS BEING SCORED BY GERARD VAN AMEYDEN, A NEAT LOB OVER THE STRANDED KEEPER, DOE, A 20 METRE VOLLEY IN-OFF THE POST, AND SYMONDS WHO COMPLETED HIS HATRICK BY SLIDING HOME A LEFT

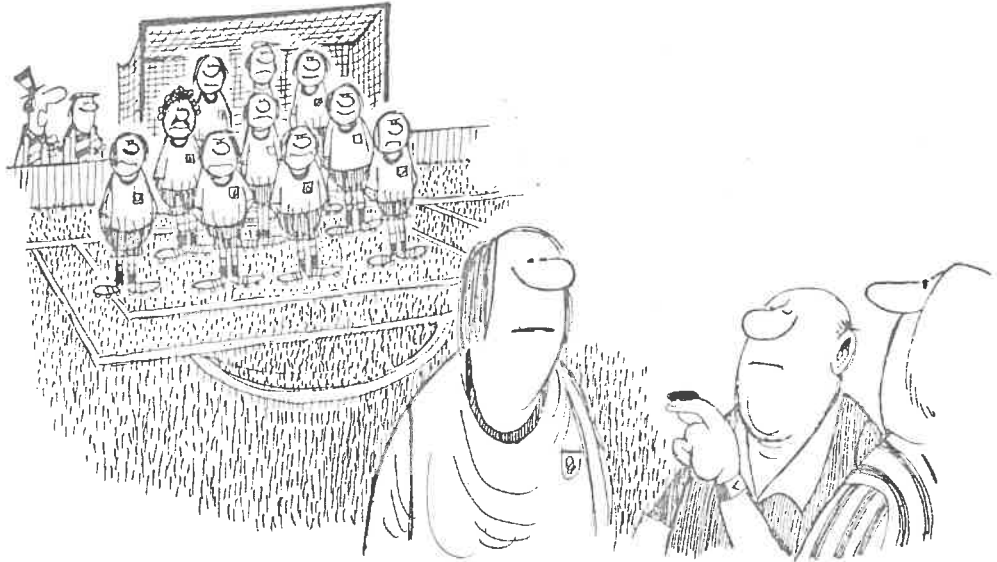

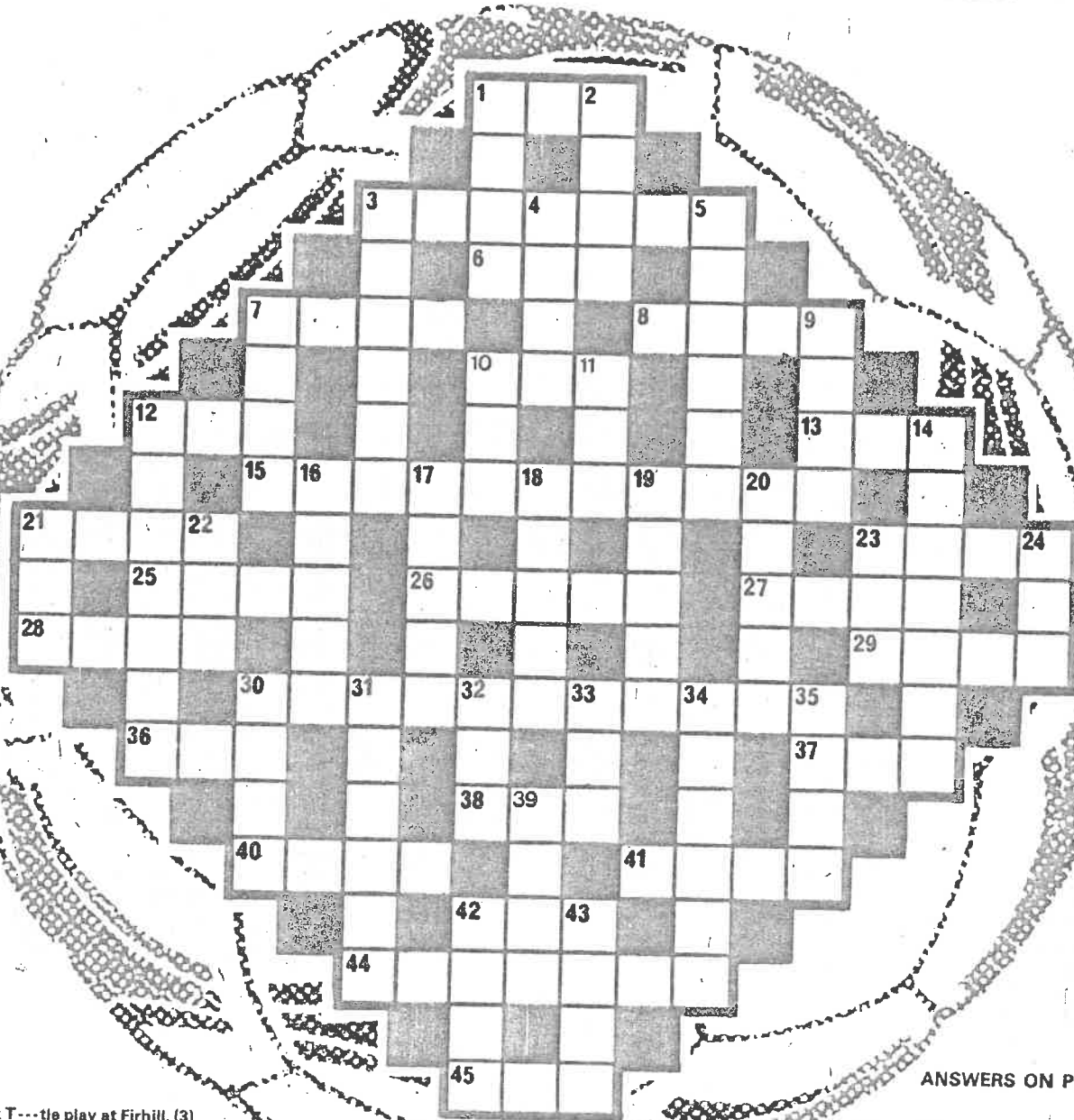

CENTENARY PARK 8.8.82.

CITY PLAYED SECOND PLACED MULGRAVE IN A MATCH WHICH ALWAYS PROMISED TO BE A TIGHT AFFAIR IN A SUNNY BUT WINDSWEPT CENTENARY PARK STADIUM.

FRANKSTON HAD PREPARED FOR THE MATCH WITH A VERY RIGOROUS TRAINING SESSION ON WEDNESDAY EVENING WHICH INVOLVED A 10KM GRUELING RUN AND SPRINTS.

IT WAS A VERY TOUGH AND PHYSICAL GAME IN A MATCH CITY DESERVED TO WIN AND PROBABLY WOULD HAVE IF NOT FOR TWO DEPLORABLE DECISIONS BY THE REF.

CITY BEGAN THE MATCH IN GOOD FASHION BY PLAYING GOOD OPEN ATTACKING FOOTBALL, AND WERE PARTICULARLY UNLUCKY WHEN KEITH CRUMPTON ROCKED THE CROSSBAR WITH A SOMEWHAT FREE-KICK.

WITH CITY PRESSING EVEN MORE A GOAL LOOKED ON THE CARDS, AND IT CAME. BUT IT WAS MULGRAVE WHO SCORED ON A COUNTERATTACK WHICH CAUGHT THE CITY DEFENCE NAPPING.

PLAYING WITH THE WIND BEHIND THEM CITY HAD TO MAKE FULL USE OF THE ADVANTAGE, BUT WHEN HALF TIME ARRIVED MULGRAVE STILL HELD THEIR ONE NIL LEAD, ALTHOUGH, NO-ONE IN THE GROUND COULD UNDERSTAND WHY THE REFEREE WOULD GIVE CITY A PENALTY WHEN JASON SYMONDS BROKE THROUGH ONLY TO HAVE HIS SHIRT ALMOST PULLED OFF HIS BACK BY A MULGRAVE DEFENDER, THUS ENABLING THE MULGRAVE DEFENCE TO CLEAR.

IN THE SECOND HALF WITH THE WIND BLOWING IN THEIR FACE CITY CAME OUT FIGHTING AND GOT JUST REWARD WHEN SYMONDS COLLECTED THE BALL BEAT TWO OPPONENTS AND LAID OFF A KNEE HIGH BALL TO STEVEN CLARKE WHO HIT A FIRST TIME VOLLEY WHICH GAVE THE KEEPER NO CHANCE. JUST BEFORE FULL-TIME A MULGRAVE DEFENDER BLANTANTLY HANBAULLED THE BALL IN HIS OWN BOX BUT THE

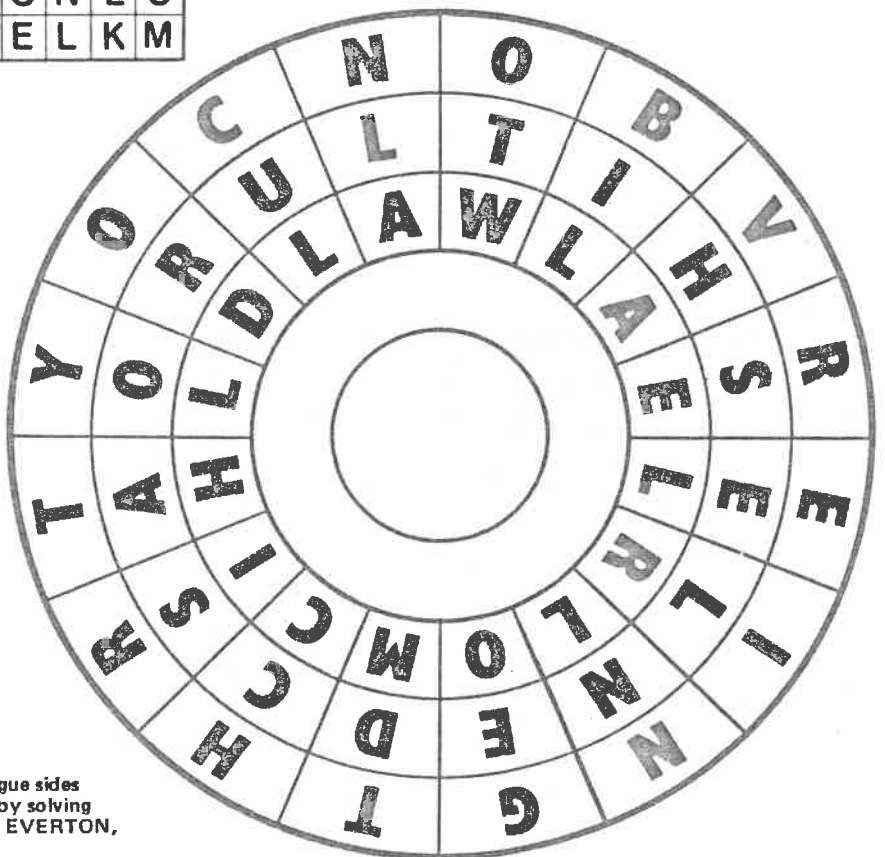

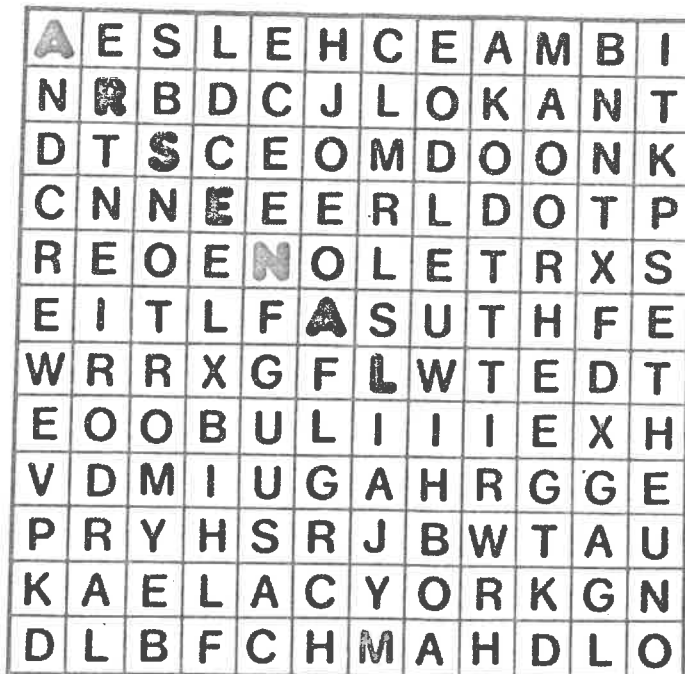
