FRANKSTON TRAVELLED TO EGANLEE RESERVE, WANTIRNA SOUT IN SEARCH OF TWO POINTS AGAINST MIDTABLE KNOX CITY. THE TALE OF THE TWO CITIES WAS DOMINATED FRANKSTON, WHO SHAMMED IN EIGHT GOALS WITHOUT REPLY.

CITY STARTED THE HATCH WITHOUT THEIR REGULAR LEFTBACK
MARK WALLACE WHO WAS OUT WITH INFLUENZA SO SUSTIN MORRIS
FILLED IN AT FULLBACK AND STUART DEGOEDE FOUND HIMSELF BACK





CITY PLAYED SECOND PLACED MULGRAVE IN A MATCH WHICH ALWAYS PROMISED TO BE A TIGHT IAFFAIR IN A SUNNY BUT WINDSWEPT CENTENARY PARK STADIUM.


