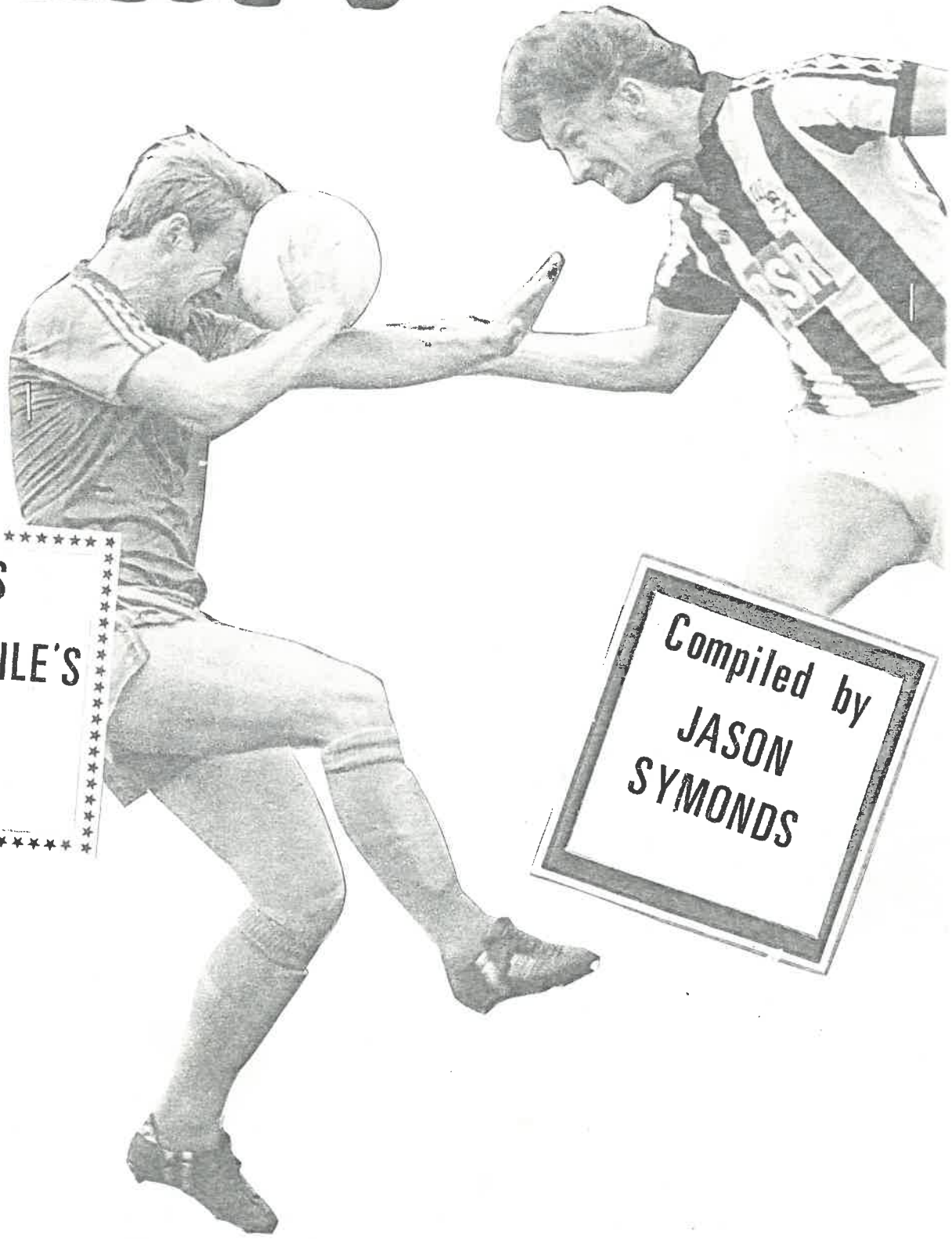

FRANKSTON CITY vs MULGRAVE

FRANKSTON WILL BE LOOKING TO MAKE AMENDS AGAINST MULGRAVE THIS SUNDAY, IN THEIR LAST ENCOUNTER CITY PLAYED THEIR USUAL ATTACKING GAME ONLY TO SEE MULGRAVE MAKE 2 BREAKAWAYS IN THE SECOND HALF AGAINST A GALE FORCE WIND TO FINISH UP THE WINNERS 2-1.

MATCH REPORT

WARNER RESERVE 4.7.82.

FRANKSTON DEFEATED LEAGUE LEADERS SOUTH SPRINGVALE 4-0 ON THEIR OWN TURF AVENGING CITY'S 1-0 LOSS IN THE FIRST MATCH OF THE SEASON. IT WAS A WELL DISCIPLINED PERFORMANCE BY CITY WHO DEFENDED WELL, GOVERNED MIDFIELD AND FINISHED WITH DEADLY ACCURACY. FRANKSTON OPENED THE SCORING WHEN THE BALL FELL TO THE SPRINGVALE CENTRE BACK, WHO SEEMED IN CONTROL IN HIS OWN HALF, BUT JASON SYMONDS OF CITY HAD OTHER IDEAS AND PRESSURED THE DEFENDER TO PLAY THE BALL BACK TO HIS KEEPER. BUT IT WAS A BAD BACKPASS, AND THIS RESULTED IN JASON BEING ABLE TO SLIDE THE BALL PAST THE ONCOMING KEEPER. THE REST OF THE HALF SAW SOUTH APPLY THE PRESSURE, BUT CITY'S DEFENCE COPE WELL, LED BY KEITH CRUMPTON WHO HAD A FINE GAME.

AFTER THE BREAK CITY OPENED UP, AND MORE CHANCES WERE BEING CREATED. BUT TEN MINUTES INTO THE SECOND HALF DARREN ARMITAGE MADE A RUN DOWN THE RIGHT AND WAS ABLE TO PUT A PERFECTLY WEIGHTED BALL ON TO THE FAR POST FOR THE ONCOMING STEVEN CLARKE TO KNOCK IN. SPRINGVALE CAME CLOSE A FEW TIMES BEFORE THE BALL WAS SPRAYED TO STEVEN CLARKE WHO RAN AT GOAL, AND WITH A DELICATE CHIP WAS ABLE TO BEAT THE STRANDED GOALIE. SOUTH CAME CLOSE WITH A FREE KICK WHICH EDDIE EREIRA PUSHED ONTO THE BAR. IN THE CLOSING MINUTES THE BALL CAME TO ARMITAGE JUST INSIDE THE BOX, WHO SMASHED THE BALL INTO THE NET TO MAKE IT 4-0.

MATCH REPORT

CENTENARY PARK 11.7.82

FRANKSTON PLAYED A SOMEWHAT LACK LUSTRE GAME AGAINST MIDTABLE NUNAWADING UNITED, THE 1-0 WIN FOR FRANKSTON WAS NOT TOTALLY CONVINCING, AND WAS QUITE A LET DOWN AFTER LAST WEEKS TREMENDOUS 4-0 WIN AGAINST 5TH SPRINGVALE. THE GAME WAS BORING AGAINST A NUNAWADING TEAM CONTENT ON JUST DEFENDING.

FRANKSTON DOMINATED THE GAME AND ATTACKED FOR 90% OF THE TIME, WITH NUNAWADING CROSSING THE HALF WAY LINE EVERY TWENTY MINUTES. CITY'S GOAL CAME AFTER 11 MINUTES IN THE FIRST HALF WHEN DARREN ARMITAGE CROSSED THE BALL FROM THE RIGHT, TO FIND JUSTIN MORRIS UNMARKED, WHO SHOT ONLY TO SEE THE GOALIE MAKE A GOOD STOP BUT HE ONLY SUCCEEDED TO KNOCK IT INTO THE PATH OF THE ONCOMING STEVEN CLARKE WHO HAMMERED IT INTO THE NET.

THE SECOND HALF WAS SIMILAR TO THE FIRST WITH NEAR MISSES FROM CITY FORWARDS, THE STORY OF THE GAME WAS, THAT THE FINAL PASS ALWAYS RUINED EACH ATTACK. ONE INJURY FROM THIS MATCH WAS TO GERARD McDONAGH WHO RECEIVED FIVE STITCHES TO A BADLY GASHED SHIN.

MATCH REPORT

WHITES LANE 18.7.82

FRANKSTON TRAVELLED TO GLEN WAVERLY EXPECTING A BRUISING ENCOUNTER WITH THE BRANDON PARK SIDE, ... AND MAYBE SUPPORTERS. BUT WHAT WE SAW WAS A TOUGH BUT FAIR GAME PLAYED BY BOTH SIDES RESULTING IN A 1-1 DRAW.

THE TWO GOALS CAME AT THE START AND END OF THE GAME WITH FRANKSTON SCORING FIRST. CITY WON THE TOSS AND DECIDED TO KICK OFF, AND WITHIN 30 SECONDS THEY WERE ONE UP. JUSTIN MORRIS TOUCHED THE BALL TO JASON SYMONDS WHO ROUNDED ONE PLAYER AND PLAYED THE BALL OUT TO DARREN ARMITAGE ON THE WING ONLY TO SEE THE BALL INTERCEPTED BY A BRANDON PLAYER WHO THEN IN TURN WAS TACKLED BY ARMITAGE, THE BALL RAN LOOSE TO SYMONDS WHO BEAT ONE PLAYER RAN INTO THE BOX AND PLACED HIS SHOT LOW TO THE KEEPER'S RIGHT HAND POST. THE GOALIE DIVED ONLY TO SEE THE BALL BEAT HIM AND INTO THE NET 1-0 TO CITY. THE REST OF THE HALF WAS DOMINATED BY CITY WHO CAME CLOSE TO SCORING MANY TIMES PARTICULARLY WHEN SYMONDS HIT THE BAR AND ARMITAGE JUST HEADING WIDE. SO INTO THE BREAK CITY WERE HOLDING A SLENDER 1-0 LEAD. AFTER THE INTERVAL IT BECAME REAL END TO END STUFF WITH BOTH SIDES COMING CLOSE TO SCORING. CITY THOUGHT THEY HAD MADE IT 2-0 WHEN ARMITAGE BEAT THE KEEPER WITH A SWERVING SHOT, BUT TO THEIR DISMAY IT WAS RULED OFFSIDE. BRANDON HIT BACK STRONGLY AND IF NOT FOR SOME FINE SAVES BY KEEPER EDDIE EREIRA COULD HAVE FOUND THEMSELVES LEVEL PEGGING. BUT THEY DID FIND THEMSELVES ON EQUAL TERMS A COUPLE OF MINUTES LATER WHEN THE BALL CAME OVER FROM THE RIGHT AND LANDED IN A STACK OF PLAYERS A SCRAMBLE DEVELOPED BUT WAS EVENTUALLY ENDED WHEN BRANDON PLAYER STABBED THE BALL HOME TO A 1-1 SCORE LINE. THIS WAS PROBABLY THE FAIREST RESULT FOR BOTH TEAMS

MATCH REPORT

CENTENARY PARK 25.7.82

FRANKSTON PLAYED A VERY DETERMINED BOTTOM SIDE IN RINGWOOD UNITED. ALTHOUGH COMFORTABLE WINNERS IN A 3-1 SCORELINE, WE AGAIN LOOKED VERY SLACK AND LETHARGIC AND IF WE ARE TO MAINTAIN OUR LEADERSHIP CHALLENGE WE MUST IMPROVE BY THE TIME WE MEET HULGRAVE IN A MATCH WHICH COULD DECIDE THE CHAMPIONS OF SOUTH EASTERN 'C'.

FRANKSTON OPENED THE SCORING MIDWAY THROUGH THE FIRST HALF WHEN WE RECEIVED A FREE-KICK NEAR RINGWOOD'S BOX. KEITH CRUMPTON TOOK THE KICK WHICH FLOATED OVER EVERYONES HEADS TO THE ONCOMING DARREN ARMITAGE WHO HEADED THE BALL INTO THE BACK OF THE NET TO MAKE THE SCORELINE 1-0 TO CITY. FRANKSTON SHOULD HAVE WENT INTO THE BREAK 3-0 UP, BUT FOR TWO BAD MISSES BY THE CITY FORWARDS. SO INTO HALFTIME WE WERE 1-0 UP. TEN MINUTES AFTER THE BREAK CITY WENT TWO UP AFTER WE WERE AWARDED A CORNER ON THE RIGHT, THE BALL CAME ACROSS AND AFTER SOME MOMENTS OF THE BALL BOBBLING ABOUT IT EVENTUALLY CAME TO DARREN ARMITAGE WHO HIT A FIRST TIME VOLLEY WHICH GAVE THE GOALIE NO CHANCE. FIVE MINUTES LATER JEFF DAWSON PLAYED A THROUGH BALL TO JASON SYMONDS WHO GLADLY OBLIGED BY STICKING THE BALL PAST THE OUTCOMING GOALIE INTO THE EMPTY NET TO MAKE UP A 3-0 SCORELINE TO FRANKSTON. RINGWOODS CONSOLATION GOAL CAME FROM A PENALTY AFTER ONE OF THE CITY BACKS ACCIDENTLY HANDLED THE BALL IN HIS OWN AREA. THE UNITED STRIKER PUT THE BALL AWAY WITH EASE TO MAKE IT 3-1 TO CITY AND ANOTHER TWO IMPORTANT POINTS.

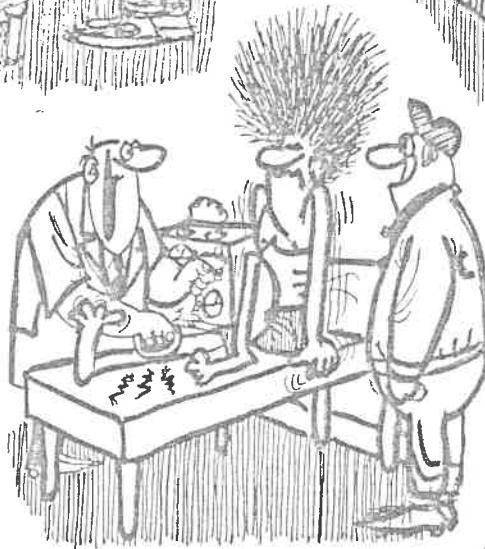

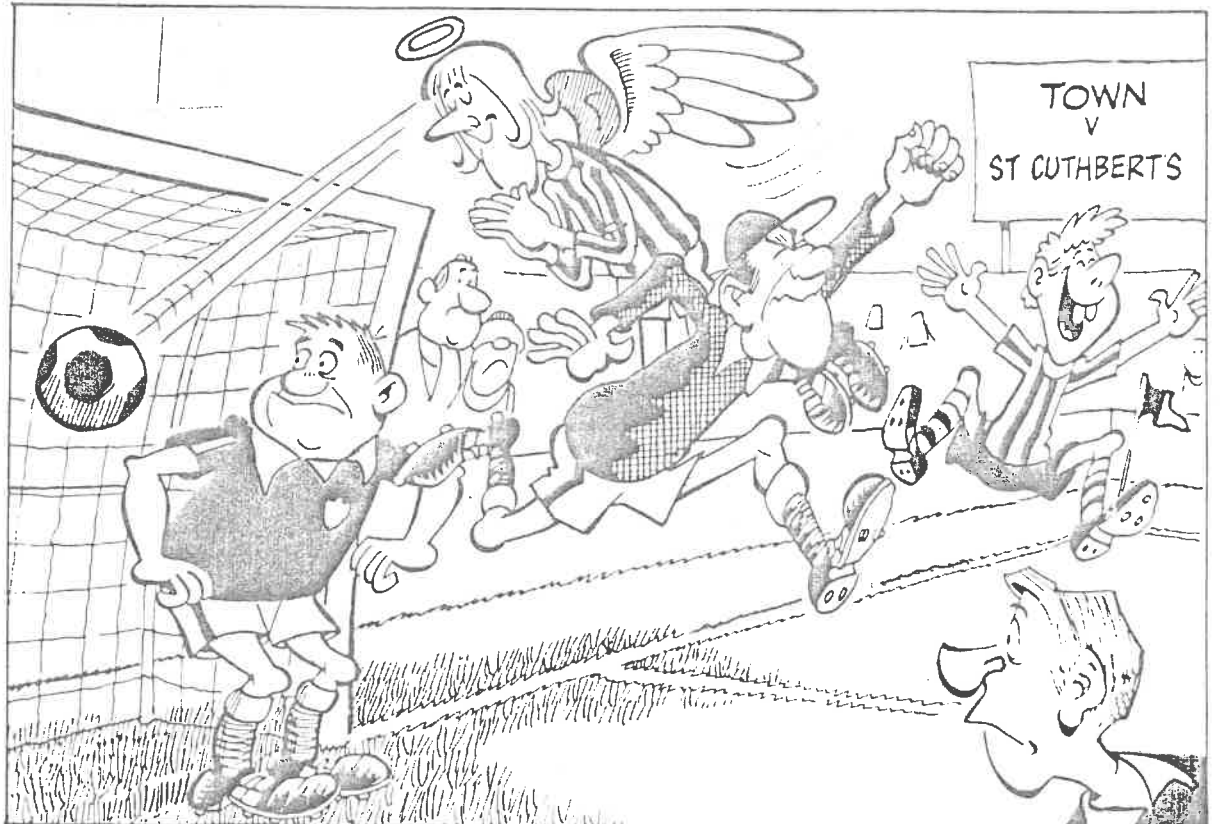

JUBILEE PARK 31.7.82

FRANKSTON SCORED ALMOST HALF OF THEIR YEARS TALLY IN ONE GAME AGAINST RINGWOOD WILHELMINA AT JUBILEE PARK LAST SATURDAY IN A THRILLING MATCH WHICH PRODUCED NINE GOALS.

IT WAS A FINE EFFORT BY CITY WHO SCORED FIVE GOALS IN THIS MATCH AND IN THEIR PREVIOUS 16 LEAGUE OUTINGS HAD SCORED ONLY 12 GOALS.

RINGWOOD OPENED THE SCORING IN THE EIGHTH MINUTE WHEN BARRY BURTON OF WILHELMINA SLAMMED HOME A CROSS WHICH CAME OVER FROM THE RIGHT BY JOE CARROLL.

THIS GOAL WHICH CITY CONCEDED WAS JUST WHAT THEY NEEDED TO SPUR THEM ON, FOR AT HALF-TIME FRANKSTON WERE LEADING 2-1 FROM GOALS BY PAUL COOKE, A 30 YARD DRIVE PAST A BEWILDERED KEEPER, IN THE 24TH MINUTE AND COLIN MITCHELL WHO PLANTED A HEADER PAST THE GOALIE FROM A PIN-POINT ACCURATE CROSS FROM GRAHAM TUTILL IN THE 33RD MINUTE.

ALMOST STRAIGHT AFTER THE BREAK CITY LED 3-1 WHEN A HIGH CROSS CAME OVER FROM THE RIGHT, THE GOALIE CAME OUT TO PUNCH BUT GRAHAM TUTILL CAME IN TO CHALLENGE, RESULTING IN THE KEEPER COMPLETELY MISSING THE BALL AND LEAVING IT TO KEVIN WALL WHO GLADLY OBLIGED BY STICKING IT INTO THE BACK OF AN EMPTY NET.

IN THE 66TH MINUTE TUTILL GAVE CITY AN ALMOST UNCATCHABLE LEAD WHEN HE SLOTTED THE BALL PAST THE KEEPER IN A ONE-ON-ONE, AFTER INTERCEPTING A POOR BACK PASS. RINGWOOD PULLED ONE BACK IN THE 68TH MINUTE WHEN CARROLL HEADED HOME A BRIAN THOM FREE-KICK, BUT TUTILL RESTORED CITY'S THREE GOAL ADVANTAGE BUT IN SCORING HE ALSO SCORED HIMSELF AN INJURY AND BEING SUBSTITUTED.

WITH THE MATCH SEEMINGLY OVER AT 5-2, RINGWOOD WAS BROUGHT TO LIFE BY CARROLL WHO SCORED ONE AND SETTED UP THE OTHER FOR DAVID HOYLAND IN THE LAST TEN MINUTES TO MAKE THE FULL TIME SCORE 5-4 TO FRANKSTON CITY AND ANOTHER TWO POINTS WHICH SHOULD HELP TO GET THEM AWAY FROM THE RELEGATION ZONE.

FRANKSTON CITY KEEN TO PERFORM WELL WITH THEIR READJUSTED TEAM AND FORMATION LINE UP, STARTED THE MATCH IN GOOD FASHION, CONFIDENTLY KNOCKING THE BALL AROUND THE PARK. IN THE EARLY STAGES A DELIGHTFULLY PINPOINT CROSS TO THE NEAR POST FROM THE EVER INDUSTRIOUS READER FOUND YOUNG SYMONDS WHO NARROWLY MISSED WITH A HEADER. THE REWARD FOR THEIR ATTACKING FLAIR EVENTUATED WHEN SCANLON SKILLFULLY GUIDED THE BALL PAST RINGWOODS KEEPER.

WILHELMINA'S ATTACK NEVER LOOKING DANGEROUS WERE AWARDED A FREE-KICK ON FRANKSTON'S 18 YARD LINE BY THE GENEROUS REF, KEEPER WALLACE VAUANTLY PARRIED THE SHOT TO A RINGWOOD FORWARD WHO WAS ABLE TO SLIDE THE BALL HOME. RINGWOOD STARTED TO PRESS THE CITY DEFENCE WHICH WAS BEING SUPERBLY MARSHALLED BY SHROEDER AND WRIGHT. AFTER ANOTHER DEBATABLE FREE-KICK, FROM ALMOST SAME POSITION AS THE PREVIOUS ONE. THE KICK WAS WELL COVERED BY WALLACE BUT IT GAINED AN UNLUCKY DEFLECTION PAST THE KEEPER.

SECOND HALF CONTINUED IN THE SAME VEIN WITH CITY DOMINATING. CITY'S WINGER CRASHED A SHOT AGAINST RINGWOODS UPRIGHT, THE EVER ALERT PARK SLAMMED HOME THE REBOUND LEVELING THE SCORES. CITY STILL LOOKING THE BETTER SIDE CONTINUED TO PRESS AND LOOKED SET FOR AT LEAST A DRAW, WHEN TRAGEDY STRUCK, AN OUTRAGEOUS DECISION BY THE REF TO ALLOW PLAY TO CONTINUE ON, WITH AT LEAST 2 RINGWOOD FORWARDS 3 METRES OFFSIDE. HEROIC KEEPER WALLACE VAINLY TRIED TO COUNTERATTACK THE 2 RAMPAGING FORWARDS AS THEY BORE DOWN ON HIM, HE SMILED, HE MUTTERED OBSENITIES IN HIS GENTLE YORKSHIRE ACCENT, BUT TO NO AVAIL AS THEY OUT-MANOUVERED HIM AND SCORED THEIR 3RD AND WINNING GOAL, BUT ON THE WHOLE QUITE A SATISFACTORY PERFORMANCE FROM THE TEAM.
