Once again, a strong City team took to the field (no suspensions!) although Paul Cooke carried an injury which eventually led to his being taken off in the 70th min. when he received a knock to the same. Ken Lyon had a busy afternoon as Ringwood's tackles left a lot to be desired. After Cooke left the field, his dynamic efforts in turning defence into attack were sorely missed. Ringwood came back from 4-1 down to 4-3. City however, regained its composure and scored again through Tutill making it 5-3 up. Ringwood scored through Hoyland two minutes from the end. Frankston also lost Tutill in the 76th min. leaving it pretty thin in experienced fit players. Buchanan was also brought down by Luyten who received his marching orders after prior cautions and a yellow card. The best goal of the match (and most of the goals were top rate) came when Wall took possession with two Ringwood players on him, passed to Paul Cooke who moved forward, took the ball 25 metres out and hit it hard and low (one metre high) giving the goalie no chance. Movements like this have gradually been coming into the team's tactics. Let's hope we see more and miss hope it is not all coming too late. It must be emphasized that our defence needs tightening up as the midfield must have more freedom to help the attack. However the improvement continues and that is the main thing. Almost every player is giving his best. A
