GREEN TOPICS

The arrival of Peter Boyle has turned this afternoon's match into something more than an ordinary league game.

The Club beat the transfer deadline by an hour on Wednesday (June 30) to rush through its costliest signing to date.

According to reliable sources Green Gully paid \$6,000 to Preston. That is the highest figure the Club has paid out for a player, but it represents a bargain when one considers that Boyle had been initially put up for sale at \$10,000.

The midfielder brings with him a ton of experience, both in the Philips League and in Scottish football.

He won a second division championship with Clyde and was the club's top scorer in two out of the five seasons he was there (1972-1977).

In those days he played a more attacking role but West Adelaide utilised his ability in the middle of the park and he played no mean part in helping the club to the Philips League championship in 1978.

He spent four seasons at the club totting up 83 PSL appearances despite spending most of 1980 with Port Adelaide. He didn't lose his goal touch either, averaging four a year.

Preston paid around \$12,000 in transfer and signing fees to sign him, almost a year ago this week and were flying him from Adelaide for matches every weekend.

The reason for his staying in South Australia was because of his job as a metallurgist, but Preston went out of its way to help him find similar employment here to get him to settle in Melbourne at the start of the season.

It came as a surprise therefore that the club transfer listed him along with three others on June 8, especially since he had played for Victoria against Watford only a few weeks earlier.

The quartet were discarded from the PSL squad but Preston's 2nd Division coach Frank McAleer con-

vinced Boyle to play for the side and he scored one of the side's goals in the shock 3-0 win over promotion candidates Werribee last week.

Peter is one of the few players who have represented two States as he also played for South Australia in international matches.

The decision to go for Boyle came at Monday night's committee meeting after consultation with coach Bobby McLachlan.

McLachlan had been keeping tabs on players available and recommended Boyle because of his experience. The coach intends to use him in midfield, but the role he'll get will depend largely on the opposition.

"The main thing was to get the numbers up" McLachlan said. "It is important to have cover for most positions. We've come so far we couldn't afford slip ups because of injuries. You've got to remember that after this week you can't rush out to buy a player".

McLachlan had Boyle under him in the State squad and says he'll be "good for the club". "He's an industrious player — a good grafter who really loves the game".

Apart from Boyle, Gully also made approaches for Jimmy Rooney. But the former Socceroo captain had already given his word to Croydon and was honest enough not to backtrack on his promise.

The other addition to the squad will be Peter Dickson who should arrive within a fortnight, barring any hiccups in the system. Dickson, like Boyle, is 30 years old and oozes experience. He has spent over eight years at Queen of the South and represented Scotland twice, although not at full international level.

He has in recent months been playing at fullback, but previously was a front runner and that is the position he's likely to be tried in on his arrival.

Gus MacLeod is an old friend of Dickson and it was he who convinced the club to go for the player. Gus was in touch with Dickson by phone earlier in the week and was told that the contract binding the player to Gully had been mailed in Scotland last Monday.

If Peter Boyle makes his debut for Green Gully this afternoon, he will become the 67th player to have worn the Green jersey for the Club since Ajax was promoted to the State League in 1977.

Having reached the halfway mark of the season, it seems appropriate to have a glance back at the players and records over the past five seasons.

Gully has scored 183 goals in the 123 State League matches played to date — an average of just under 1.5 per game.

Few at Green Gully Reserve this afternoon will need reminding that the first three seasons in top company brought struggles against relegation, although there was the bright spark in 1979 when the club won the pre-season Ampol Cup.

The arrival of McLachlan provided the turning point in 1980 and only 24 months later the club was sitting proudly at the top having won its first ever State League Championship.

Hopefully the same can be repeated this season.

Already the team has equalled the number of goals (32) scored in the whole of the '78 season (although of course, there were four matches less then).

In the first season in State League, Green Gully used 28 players, a figure which was almost halved in the championship year.

This season 18 have been used to date, but Boyle and Dickson will push that up to 20 later this month.

The other players to don the green jumper for the first time in senior matches this year have been David Smallman, Ron Kremers and Robbie McLachlan.

The full list of 66 players reads as follows:

As mentioned in the previous edition of Green Topics, Lou Denys is still streets ahead of all opposition in the overall appearances stakes.

The Keeper is still building on his consecutive tally, not having missed a league game since making his debut for the Club in April 1977.

The two players to make the biggest climbs since the end of last season are Jim Williams and Paul Lewis, both of whom have jumped up 14 positions with everpresent records this season.

Williams is now in 18th position, while Lewis has moved from 48th to 34th.

Willie Vassallo has moved up a notch into second position after overtaking John Patten. Willie will be playing in his 95th league match today.

Of the present day players the next one down the list is David Hogben who now has 56 appearances to his credit (9 as substitute) and has moved up to 7th.

In the goalscoring stakes big Gus has widened the gap on his challengers while Paul Lewis has climbed from 27th to 4th with his 8 goals this season.

Our Visitors FRANKSTON

Despite limited resources, Harry Chalkitis has made wholesale changes since taking over as coach pre season after the club's close call with relegation at the end of last year.

Some of the departures have not been his own doing and he'll be the first to admit the club is missing the goal scoring prowess of Charlie Egan and the experience of Carl Halford Both are playing Philips League soccer with South Melbourne now but their transfer fees totalling some \$13,000 have helped keep the club solvent.

Partly through necessity Chalkitis has gone for youth and is giving up and coming players like Robbie Reader, Carlos Gonsalves and Eddie Ormond the chance to prove themselves in the State League.

The dips into the transfer market have been for players whom he's had under him before either at Prahran Slavia or Melbourne. These include Paul Drinoczky, Paul Cooke, Cliff Whiteside and David Pve.

They take the place of a number of long serving players, who have moved to greener pastures. The departures included evergreen Bob Adams who moved to Mornington after he had nearly become part of the furniture in 13 years at the club, tough tackling Danny McCluskey who joined Kew City via Preston, fullback Frank Thompson, midfielder Dave Cooper who has taken on a player coaching position in the Metropolitan League. Eric Lesbirel who moved to Knox City and Sandy Irvine who rejoined Morwell Falcons.

The present side badly lacks scoring power and the club were desperately trying to resolve that before the transfer deadline.

The relegation battle seems to be settling into a two out of three situation between City, Northcote and Doveton and a lot will depend on encounters between the trio to sort the matter out.

Frankston seems to play its best soccer against the top sides and has taken draws off Melbourne Croatia and George Cross as well as beating Hellas-Hakoah, so this afternoon's match will be no cakewalk despite the 5-0 win Gully achieved at the start of the season at Centenary Park.

David Gilbert:

Rated the best keeper in the recently completed National Youth title in Canberra but surprisingly elected to dropout of the 24 man national squad selected by Les Scheinflug, to prepare for the World Youth Championship elimination matches. Frankston signed Frank Petersen as a stop gap while Gilbert was away in Canberra for the National championship and the youngster has since found it hard to win his place back. Earlier this year he was wanted by Preston to understudy Richard Wilson but then too he decided against a move forward in his career apparently because of the travelling involved. The 18 year-old 6ft 2in. keeper first broke into the Frankston team in 1979 ironically enough taking over from Petersen for two league matches. That year he was voted the club's most promising player and was sent to Norwich for a two month training stint. He was promoted to No.1 choice last year and played in 20 league games.

David Pye:

Fullback signed pre-season after six years at

Prahran Slavia. Made his league debut at left back against Green Gully on the opening day of the season but has more recently switched to the right in place of the injured David Whiteside. Started out as a midfielder at Slavia making his debut in May '76 against Polonia Maribyrnong (LO-1). He nailed a regular spot in 1977 figuring in 19 league matches and scoring his only league goal to date vs Polonia in a 4-1 win. After 9 lean seasons he regained his place at fullback and figured in the Slavia side which lost to Gully in the Ampol Cup final in March 1979. By the end of 1980 had totted up 54 State League appearances then elected to stay at Slavia in their first year in the Metro last season. At Frankston has figured in the back four in all but one of the club's 15 league and (Dockerty) Cup matches, the exception being against Springvale in the Cup where he figured in the middle of the park. Age: 25.

Paul Drinoczky:

Lanky centreback who gained a small measure of revenge when Frankston beat Hellas-Hakoah on June 5. Drinoczky was all set to break into the State League last year by

moving from Melbourne to George Cross but the then Cross coach Jim Adam decided against the buy at the time. Adam was of course in charge of the Hellas side which suffered the shock result last month to the Baysiders. Frankston coach Harry Chalkitis, having had Drinoczky under his wing at Melbourne had no doubts about his ability to play State League and signed him at the start of the season for \$3000. Like Pye, he made his league debut for the club against Green Gully and the pair are the only everpresents in the side todate. Paul has an equally tall brother who is figuring in Melbourne's unbeaten run in the second division.

Graham Tutill:

Currently filling the sweeper position because of his experience, but his high work rate demands an almost certain return into midfield once the club can find an adequate last man. Tutill joined Frankston in a round about manner last year. He was originally supposed to join George Cross but trained only once there as he settled with relatives in the Eastern suburbs. He played alongside his cousin at Cranbourne for a short period before being snapped up by Frankston in July making his debut against Croydon in a 2-0 victory. He scored two goals against Northcote last season but has as yet to open his account in the league this season. Age:27.

Colin Mitchell:

Now back playing in the State League after an absence of four years. Was looked upon as a big discovery in 1977 with Prahran Slavia but his early promise was dashed mercilessly into the ground with a bad leg break against Hakoah after only 7 league games to his credit. Worked his way back into the game at Frankston Pines and figured in that club's gradual rise as a force in the Metropolitan League over the past two seasons. Joined City at the start of the season and his friendship with Kevin Wall influenced the former Green Gully striker into joining him at the club. Mitchell is normally a midfielder but has now played four matches at left back. He scored one of the goals in the 2-1 victory over Springvale in the Dockerty Cup.

Cliff Whiteside:

Midfielder signed on loan from Queensland State League Club Townsville till the end of the season. Whiteside was a \$7000 signing from Prahran Slavia by Townsville at the time when Tim White, the Victorian State Coach was in charge of the club. Originally migrated to Australia from Irish club Bangor making his debut for Slavia in a Philips Cup match against Heidelberg (then Fitzroy) (L3-6) in May 1978. He stayed with the club for three years captaining the side in their last season in the State League in 1980. His brother Dave joined him at Townsville last year and the pair have now joined forces again at Frankston. Age: 28. Cliff made his debut for the Baysiders against Hellas-Hakoak (WI-0)

Paul Cooke:

Another Prahran Slavia exile, Cooke joined Frankston in May after a length wrangle for a release from his former club. Cooke took his case to the tribunal claiming Slavia had · broken his contract in failing to meet medical expenses for injuries incurred in playing soccer. But he had to appeal twice to have his fee reduced to just over \$2000. At Slavia he broke into the senior side in 1979 after coming out from Premier League Club South Liverpool. He made 24 State League appearances for the club and scored one goal (against Frankston City). His best scoring feat however came against Green Gully in the Dockerty Cup but his two goals weren't enough as Gully won the tie 3-2 in 1980. At Frankston he made his debut in the 1-2 away defeat at Polonia on May 16 and has figured largely in midfield since.

Rob Stewart:

Scot who has resumed his original role as striker and recently hit home vital goals against Hellas-Hakoah and George Cross. The 20 year old made ten appearances and scored a goal in the Premier League in Scotland for Hearts before coming to Australia to join South Melbourne on the recommendation of Eamonn Bannon the Scottish International brother of Juve players Pat. Vince and Ged. The youngster however 'failed to make an impact at South and was loaned to Frankston in Feb. 1981. The Baysiders have since signed him airtight for \$3000. Stewart made his debut for the club in an Ampol Cup game against Altona (22.2. 81 W2-0) and then went on to become an everpresent in the League. He was switched to the sweeper role midway thru the season and kept that position until May this season when he reverted to an attacking role along side Billy Buchanan.

Bill Buchanan:

Fair-haired striker who has landed all the scoring responsibilities since the departure of Charlie Egan. Is now the club's longest serving player (apart from Norrie Campbell) having figured in the club's promotion year in 1976. He played 21 league games, mostly in midfield, in the club's first season in top company, then spent two seasons at Dandenong City before returning in 1980. Was an everpresent in the league last year and scored six goals to boot, and has now played in over 70 league games for the club. The side's penalty taker. Age: 29.



Kevin Wall:

Striker who missed nearly all of June because of a groin injury. Will need no introduction to Green Gully fans, having figured in the 1981 championship season at the club and also scored two goals in the Ampol Cup triumph over Croydon. Kevin started out at Frankston Pines but first caught the eye at Frankston City when he scored 12 goals in his first senior season in 1980. At Gully he netted 4 in 18 league matches last year but he found the travelling from Frankston. to St.Albans for training too much and rejoined the Baysiders at the start of the season for \$2000. His first matches for Frankston on both occasions have been against Gully, Age: 21.

Frank Petersen:

Came out of retirement to help the club out of a spot of bother and to keep Dave Gilbert on his toes but has done so well that he seems to have nailed down the regular spot between the sticks. The 33 year-old keeper has seen service with four clubs and is in his second spell at Frankston having been bought in a similar rush in 1977 to replace Terry Hawke who walked out on the club after being substituted in an Ampol Cup game. His other clubs have been South Melbourne, George Cross and Keilor. His record of appearances for Frankston reads 1977: 20 apps. 1978: 18 apps + 1 sub; 1979 21 apps.

Rob Reader:

Scored his first senior goal a fortnight ago against Croydon. First promoted to the senior team in the 1981 Ampol Cup when he played 1 full match and made three substitute appearances. Is competing for a mid-field spot with Eddie Ormond this year.

Carlos Gonsalves:

Signed along with Arthur Giannakis from Metropolitan League club South Melbourne Mordialloc. Made his debut against Northcote in April (L1-2) and has since held a fairly regular spot in the team. Recently switched from midfield to winger role.
