Welcome to Round 6 of the 2013 Season - Peninsula Strikers V Frankston Pines

Welcome all players, members, friends and families of Peninsula Strikers. Welcome visiting players, committee and spectators of Frankston Pines. I sincerely hope you all have an enjoyable afternoon here with us at Centenary Park.

Today marks another local derby, one of fierce rivalry and pride between our two clubs. Both of which have produced some fantastic football over the years and have definitely fared better, than where we see ourselves today. In 2011 both clubs featured in a 4 all draw & a 1 nil win to Strikers. One thing that hasn't changed is the pride that both clubs have in their logo, traditions and the pride and commitment of the players who wear our shirts.

In saying that, today marks 20 years since Karingal United Soccer Club and Frankston United Soccer Clubs amalgamated to form Peninsula Strikers FC. There are many of you who were a part of those two clubs 20 years ago, who are still involved with Peninsula Strikers today; a club of tradition pride and loyalty. To those members, I thank you for your support.

I will be the first to say, it hasn't been a terrific start to the season for us, being O from 5. If you have seen all of our games to date, I'm sure you will agree, apart from Old Scotch we have been more than just competitive. To say the soccer God's haven't been kind to us is an understatement. We have been very unlucky. So far this season we have already played both teams who were relegated from Div2, with 1nil result. Very respectable, given both clubs can afford larger player payments having more substantial budgets.

Last Sunday we played Caulfield now second on the table. In my opinion we played Caulfield off the park most of the day, after hitting the crossbar then the post which travelled the full length of the goal, with several shots just off target it could have been 3-1 at half time. If you don't convert your chances and we had many, generally it results in a loss. I hope today we will put that behind us and break the curse of the 'Voodoo doll'. At around 4:45pm we hope to be singing our song strong and loud, with pride and gusto. Good Luck boys.

Many things change each year / season. While it's easy to ride the good times with the support of the loyal members who remain supporting our club, regardless - It's a shame we have some, who choose to continually knock, kick and criticise the club when things are down. True supporters and club people, are there week in and week out. Let's face it, no one wants to lose and that has not been our intention, although champagne teams don't happen on beer budgets. Sometimes, it gets tough but we need to weather the storm together as one. No individual makes the Club. We ask our players to play as a team on the park; this should also happen off the park with our members.

Happenings / Club Projects / Future Vision

Without a vision Peninsula Strikers FC remains the same.

So where are we heading? What's on the table at the moment? - After having land fill placed at the rear of the current training ground, the plan was to increase this area and add further grounds, unfortunately without irrigation the grass has died, so this area cannot be used. We are negotiating with council to have this rectified. This was not what was promised in the outset. We hope that this will be completed by the end of the season. We are negotiating once again for the club to contribute in kind to have this project undertaken total cost 30K. Once completed, we will have two training grounds and another competition ground running lengthways across the width, enabling our club to expand. This season we have six teams - an increase of three from 2012. We hope this will accommodate at least 3 more teams in the near future, while giving teams a greater area for training.

New Training Lights

After many years of sub-standard lighting, I am happy to inform you that this week the clubs Special Projects Manager, Peter Stuckenschmidt and myself had our first meeting with council. At this stage the club has agreed with council after being confirmed by members of the Soccer Liaison Committee (Representative of all Clubs) who agreed that our current lighting requires upgrading. We should know if we have been successful after the end of Oct 13 with the project to commence in 2014.

Pergola / Covered Area Club Entrance:-

After having the concrete completed in exposed aggregate recently by "Burdetts" one of our very generous sponsors, the PSFC committee have decided that the concrete area at the entrance side of the club should be covered first. I have a sponsor to provide the materials for the roof; the club will have to pay for the vertical metal posts (12) ourselves. A Stalwart and great supporter of the club Kevin McGuiness has offered to erect the roof for the club with his employee's -Thank you Kev. If anyone knows a Draftsman we require drawings to be completed for submission to council for approval. If anyone is, or knows a draftsman who would like to donate their time, please let me know. We would love to provide the improvements to the club and better facilities for your pleasure / comfort and enjoyment.

NPL (National Premier League)

In mid-2012 FFA announced a new competition throughout Australia called the (National Premier League) this competition commenced in all other states this year. Prior to the clubs AGM last year, your committee sat down and looked at a vision for Peninsula Strikers FC, one of our which was to investigate and work towards putting the club on the map having our club / consortium to possibly provide an opportunity for players across all age groups with the best coach's available at each level to play at the highest level locally, in a competition across the state of Victoria.

National Premier League will sit one (1) below the "A" League (Melbourne Victory & Heart.) This league will encompass Men's and Women's competitions from juniors thru to seniors with the competition commencing in Feb 2014 – Nov 2014. 

Due to the late release by the FFV it's been difficult to inform all club members of the committee vision and interest in this competition. At the present time your club has placed an expression of interest with the FFV.


