Bayside Soccer League **We've Come A Long Way**

Conception of our League began in August, 1977 and finally came to fruition with the Gala Day put on by Karingal Soccer Club early April and then the League's official start on Sunday 10th April, 1978

Earlier problems with the Soccer Federation were settled although Karingal Soccer Club felt obliged to discontinue its team in our League.

Hastings Soccer Club failed to get enough players to put a side, and so the first round consisted of seven clubs competing.

Botany Park Soccer Club was formed and although unable to compete until midway through the season proved a competitive side.

The eight team league were competing for the Safeway Shield later to become the SAFEWAY—DAVID BONAR SHIELD.

David, his wife and two children were tragically killed on holiday in Western Australia. Skye Soccer Club, for whom David played, approached the league to have the Shield named after David in some way and the committee had no hesitation in honouring this valued player.

3MP, the Local Bayside Radio Station, agreed to donate the 3MP Cup as a perpetual knockout trophy.

The League and Cup were both close competitions to the end.

North Seaford became the first League winners, with Mt Eliza holding them until the final two rounds.

The 3MP Cup Final held at North Seaford Reserve attracted a crowd nearly three hundred and fifty people.

Disc Jockey Phil O'Brien of 3MP presented captain Brian Summerfield of the Navy with the Cup after they had stopped North Seaford's aspirations of the double with a 3—2 victory after extra time.
