Seniors Match Report

Today we welcome Old Scotch to McClelland drive for what promises to be a cracker of a match. Two remaining teams in our league who remain unbeaten so far in 2016. A top of the table clash.

Last week we went to Noble Park with the news that our inform Striker, Paul Presti being unavailable due to a knock he sustained on Thursday at training. Paul has been in fine goal scoring form notching 5 goals in a game and a half. With Paul's absence and Cam Leopold unavailable due to his suspension, we were forced into making a number of changes to our starting 11 from the previous great performance against Doncaster. Coming back into the team against Noble Park was experienced duo Tasim, Lindrium and Ibraim. Our right wing back Callum was left on the bench due to concerns about a niggling back complaint, however taking his place was Joey Buccello who stayed in the side after a strong performance against Doncaster.

As the first half wore on, we managed to get a good foothold in the game and a surging run from Matt Morris Thomas from the half way line, beating his defender enabled him the opportunity to go through on the keeper. Matt, coolly struck the ball past the keeper into the far post to give us the lead at half time. We almost seen the goal of the season during the first half when Trevor Johnson struck a magnificent overhead scissors kick from a corner, which was heading for the far right top corner, only for the Noble Park goalkeeper to make a fingertip save. Such is the discipline and determination of this year's playing group, a few words were said at half time by all, which galvanised our efforts in the second half. It was clear to see that we were not going to settle on a 2 goal lead and a short corner and a great cross from Iba, seen Matt Morris Thomas rise at the back post to head past the goalkeeper to secure his Hat Trick. A fine Hat Trick from Matt who is starting to settle in at the club.

I must make comment on our defending this year. The determination, discipline and desire to stay organised and work as a unit has enabled us the foundations of which we have reaped the rewards so far this season.
