EDITORIAL.

We are now fully involved in Season '77, and again K.U.S.C. are numerically one of the strongest Clubs in Victoria, fielding 14 teams with 200 players registered. To successfully run a large club requires a strong back up team. Viz. Managers, Coaches and an active Executive, (we are fortunate in that we also have a successful fund raising affiliated club, namely "The Red Devils' Social Club", as a back up). Currently, one of the major problems is a shortage of Managers. Our Executive have done research into why, with so many boys playing, we cannot encourage interested Parents to don the mantle of Managership. Our Secretary suggests that the title of Team Manager, may deter people, thinking that one requires to have been a past professional player or steeped in a soccer environment was a necessary prerequisite. Whilst this would be desirable, all we require is a mature person, interested in youth, able to maintain team sheets, check Passports, arrange transport to matches and maintain soccer gear issued to the team and represent their team at Monthly Committee meetings.

If any Parent would care to discuss the Manager-ship positions, any of the Executive would be pleased to hear from him.

SECRETARY'S REPORT.

Managers should note that League games postponed due to the strike must be played on Sat. May 14th (U.7 and U.14 excepted). U.7 League games should be played on Sat. 7th May. Please use grounds detailed to your match. No.1 ground is at the eastern end of Ballam Park. No.2 ground is at western end. No.3 ground is in the centre close to car park and No. 4 is for U.7 and U.8, close to Athletic area. (U.14 cup game, as notified, must be played Sat.30th April.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

Playing fees and subs from non-playing members are coming in steadily with \$1,003. received so far. Sale of club badges, stickers and donations have brought in a further \$132.42. The U.11As with 10 fees paid are doing very well, while U.15s, U.14s and Seniors are a little slow to part with their cash!

WHERE DOES THE MONEY GO? To date expenses have included \$297.38 on strips, socks, balls, \$70.23 on lime, weed killer (pitch marking), \$125.22 to the S.E.C., \$59.80 line marker, \$282.50 on VSF, JLMC transfer, registration, affiliation fees, \$163.17 on ads., printing, audit fees, etc. and \$232.18 on end of 1976 year banners and trophies.

The club is relying on all players and members doing the right thing and getting behind the club financially to raise over \$2,000. from fees and subs, leaving the hardworking Social Club free to start clearing the \$18,000. debt on the new clubhouse. \$400. ground rent is also due to Frankston Council soon. So, come on, give it a go - and I'll take your money anytime!
