# SECRETARY'S REPORT

With only a couple of weeks to go before the junior program starts, we have unfortunately been forced to withdraw one of our teams from the competition. That team is the Under 13A, one of the best teams in the club last year. Not one player from the side is available to us this year. Most of the players have just dropped out of soccer. Last year we had two Under 13 sides, this year we have only one Under 14 team. This means a wastage of players that we cannot afford as a club. Out of the two squads mentioned, at least half a dozen boys have transferred to other clubs and at least eight have just dropped out of the game altogether.

This highlights a problem in junior soccer and particularly in our club, for that is our concern. Maybe the boys are being pressured too much, or maybe more is being expected of some of them than they are capable of giving. To stay in the game a boy must want to play and he must enjoy playing. As soon as the enjoyment of playing is lost, the boys is lost to the game, and enjoyment doesn't always come from simply winning. A winning side is not necessarily a happy side. Coaches would do well to remember this. Coaching and training must be made interesting and varied. Castigating a boy for an error is not going to keep him in the game, if it happens too often. An error on the part of the boy should be explained, an error on the part of the team should be explained. It is far more important that the boys stay in the game than it is that they should win a championship or a trophy at the end of the year.

There is always a certain wastage of players from year to year, but it should be minimal, one or two at the most from a team. When it gets above that number there has got to be something wrong and the finger must be pointed at the people in charge of those boys, namely the coach and manager. By this, I do not mean that we have a group of coaches and managers that are not doing their job - in most cases they are doing their best, they are all volunteers after all - I suggest only that in some cases a little more thought should go into the job.

We must all remember that we are not in the game simply for our own benefit or ego. We are in it to teach the boys to play, to foster the game of soccer and to provide our senior teams with players in the future. If we do not keep the boys in the game, particularly between the ages of 13 and 16 we have failed in our aims.

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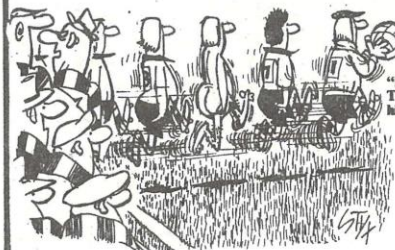

# PLAYER PROFILE

## BOB BRICKLEY

Success in soccer comes from team effort but every successful team needs a bit more than that. It needs a driving force. Someone to lift them when they are down and urge them on even harder when they are winning. At Karingal, Bob Brickley is that someone. A lot of the present success of our seniors must be due to Bob's solid play and enthusiasm in every game.

What does Bob have in common with Geoff Boycott-apart of course, from fame, wealth, success? They both hail from Yorkshire. Bob was born in Staithes in July 1949 and he lived there for the next 22 years.

Like most "pommie" kids, his start to soccer came by kicking a ball around in the street. He carried on playing in school teams right through school at St. Joseph's, Sacred Heart Secondary - and other approved schools.

In 1965 he left school and took up bricklaying as a trade. His choice of employers was easy. He always went to the highest payers! That year he joined Staithes Athletic Club Under 18 team in the Teeside League before moving up to the seniors in the Eskdale League. He stayed with them until 1969/70 and in all that time they were either winners or runners up in the league and cup every year.

Bob got married in 1969 in a church at Southbank near Middlesboro. That same year he transferred from Staithes A.C. to Portmulgrave in the Eskdale League and two years later they were runner's up in the league cup. Bob is sure they would have won if he hadn't missed the final by coming out here!

In March 1971, Bob moved to Australia after a month's cruise on the way. He settled in Chelsea and went back to bricklaying - again for the highest payer! After a couple of years of that he became self employed - that is when he is motivated enough!

Initially, he played for Doveton in the Provisional League. The team came third in the league but were promoted anyway because of their good facilities. In 1972, he joined Springvale in the Metropolitan League and stayed with them for six years. In that time, they were relegated from Division 1 in 1975, promoted again in 1977 and were runners up in the league cup in 1978.

Bob moved to Frankston to live in 1975 and the following year he became the proud father of young Jason.

It was another two years before Bob signed up for Karingal Soccer Club. The team hasn't won any medals yet but he is certain that the best is yet to come.

It must be mentioned that Bob still supports Middlesboro in England which makes him almost as rare as a Morton supporter over here!

Bob Brickley is a popular member of our club. On the field, serious and very determined, off the field, always ready with a smile and a quiet joke. Bob is a fine example for our juniors to follow.

Bob is very enthusiastic about Karingal's future. Now that we are winning games we must keep winning them. He also feels that it is a great pity we can't put our juniors on contract to stop other senior clubs pinching them!

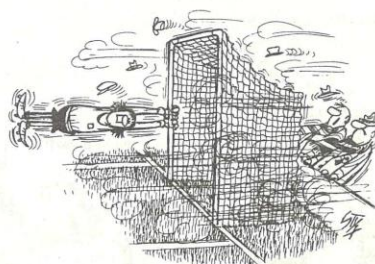

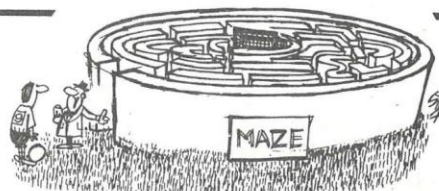
The evening starts at 7 p.m. and goes on until about 10 p.m. Every boy who is keen on his soccer should try and come along and see these great films.

## CLUB PERSONALITY

### DICK JONES

It is rare in any sporting club to find people who are willing to give all their time, effort and support, but who do not seek any official position or recognition. Dick Jones is one such person at Karingal. He was the well deserved winner of the best clubman award last year, and already this year, he has organised and worked on a number of building projects around the clubrooms. Our club is lucky to have him with us.

Dick was born in Liverpool in England in February 1943. At the time things were pretty grim over there. The country was at war. It was the middle of winter and all competitive soccer had been suspended. Dick's arrival must surely have lifted the gloom in Liverpool. It meant yet another new member for the Red Army at Anfield!

Soccer was in his blood right from the start. He played soccer in junior school and carried this through to the Central Boys team at 15 (1958), Clubmoor in the Liverpool League at 17 (1960), and Ford United at 21 (1964). It was not all laughs though. Liverpool only managed one championship title during this time and spent several years down in the Second Division.

After leaving school, Dick worked as an apprentice at "Mersey Tooling", before taking on several jobs in Engineering. In 1962, he met Barbara at a New Years Eve Party and three years later they were married in the Sacred Heart Church, Hall Lane in Liverpool.

1967 was a turning point in Dick's life, Manchester United won the league, Scotland beat England at Wembley and Celtic won the European Cup. It was just too much and it was time to get out. In July of that year Dick and Barbara moved to Australia!

They lived in Caulfield for a time and Dick's main jobs were with Lucas and Spiers Industries. He also didn't waste any time getting back into soccer, and joined Cheltenham in the old Provisional League playing against teams like Frankston Pines, Langwarrin, Doveton and Mooroolbark. He was leading goal scorer for two seasons with the club.

In 1972, Dick and Barbara settled in Frankston and within three years they were both deeply involved at Karingal - Dick as a player and Barbara as a committee member. Dick played for several years under such coaches as Kurt Schroeder, Jim Smith and Barry Bolton. He also coached and managed a number of junior teams.

Dick and Barbara have three boys - all Australians and all playing for Karingal junior teams.

The years in Australia have been good for Dick with Liverpool winning several league titles, runners-up several times, F.A.Cup winners, League Cup winners, European Cup winners, Cup Winners Cup winners and Eufa Cup winners. Especially since one of Dick's pleasures in life is to watch Manchester United fans when Liverpool wins a trophy!

Dick is one of Karingal Soccer Club's most enthusiastic supporters and one of the most popular. He would like to see more improvements to our clubrooms which would increase the membership and this in turn would help both the juniors and seniors financially and give them more support. He would also like to see Karingal Seniors playing in the Metropolitan League and with our present set up, he believes this should happen in the near future.

Who says Dick Jones's playing days are over? Recently he turned out for our Ballam Park team in the Bayside League and proved he hasn't lost his old touch. Is this the start of a new career? Kenny Dalglish - watch out!

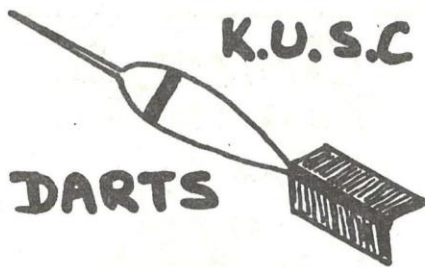
