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PLAYER PROFILES

JOHN BAIRD

Only in his second season with Karingal United, John Baird has already shown his talent to be one of the best goalkeepers in the league, and at the same time a good clubman who joins in most activities and is always willing to give a hand in the clubrooms. It is to be hoped that this is the second of many seasons yet to come with us.

John was born in Glasgow in 1961 and for the next ten years he lived with his family in the district of Castlemilk before moving to Pollokshaws, his home right up until his departure for Australia.

In 1966, he began his schooling at Braeside Primary. He spent five years there, then one year at Sir John Maxwell's Primary School, before graduating up to Shawlands Academy [High School]. His soccer career started early as well - when he was six years old in primary school and he continued playing right throughout his schooldays.

John really got down to serious soccer in 1972 - when he was eleven! As well as playing for Shawlands Academy, he also joined St. Mary's Juniors and in the next four years his team won four league titles and seven cups. He left school in 1976 and began work as an apprentice engineering fitter. He went on playing soccer and in 1979 he played for Queens Park in the Scottish Second Division. That same year he transferred to Dunbarton in the same league and he played for the Reserve team just prior to making his decision to travel to Australia early in 1980.

When he arrived in Melbourne, John moved in with his brother-in-law Jack Lyons and then went to work with him as an apprentice painter and decorator. After a holiday in Sydney, he joined Kenworth Trucks Pty.Ltd., and he is employed with them at present.

Jack Lyons was already a player at Karingal and John soon found his way to our club and started playing for us towards the beginning of last season. He very quickly established himself as the regular first team goalkeeper and apart from the occasional injury, he has held that position ever since. Last season the senior team finished fifth in the league - their highest ever position. So far this season they have the second best defensive record in the league. John has been very much an important part of all that.

John sees Karingal as a soccer club with a definite future, starting hopefully with promotion this year and going on up from there. He would like personally to thank all the supporters who come to home and away games no matter what the weather is like, since he feels that they are as important as the players themselves.

JIM HULL

Most match days at Ballam Park begin long before the kick off. Nets have to be put up, lines have to be marked out and you can be sure that Jim Hull will always be out there doing the job no matter what the weather. It is this kind of dedication that makes him such an important part of our club.

Jim was born in 1959 in the gold mining town of Ballarat. His family moved around a bit after that - to Wendouree in 1960, to Laverton in 1961 and then finally to their present home in Langwarrin in 1963.

He started school at Langwarrin Primary in 1965 and spent six years there before moving to Karingal High School where he went right through to sixth form.

Jim had a number of sporting interests during those years. He played for Langwarrin Soccer Club's Under 10 team for a year in 1969, then switched to Aussie Rules football for the next five years until he was 15. He followed this up with two years as a cyclist before coming back full circle to soccer in 1977 when he was reserve goalkeeper in the school soccer team.

In 1977, he left school and early the next year he got a job as a tradesman's assistant in the Reserve Bank. This only lasted nine weeks and then in August of that same year he became an apprentice greenkeeper at Frankston Golf Club and he has been there ever since.

In 1978, Jim joined Karingal United Soccer Club and during that first year he was goalkeeper in the third team. The following year he was keeper for the Reserves, and then the last couple of seasons he has been a regular defender in the Reserves. To anyone that watches the reserve team, there can be no doubt that this is probably Jim's best season yet and on many occasions he has been knocking on the door of first team soccer.

This year Jim has expanded his involvement in the club to become assistant secretary [soccer] on the executive committee. He has also helped a lot with the coaching of the Under 13 team. He doesn't stop at that either. He attends almost every function - he rarely misses a working bee - and he can always be relied upon to give a hand whenever it is needed.

Jim would like to see our club expand and diversify into something bigger. Promotion would be good this year but if we don't make it, then we have to keep our players and keep trying. He also believes that the juniors must get together and that the aim of all junior coaches should be to promote good soccer.

CLUB PERSONALITY JOHN TWEDDLE

Soccer clubs are always looking for its members to get more involved in the running of the club. In John Tweddle's case we just could not ask for any more. Over the years he has been a senior player, reserve coach, junior coach, assistant secretary, club manager, bar tender - what more is there? With more members like John, we could indeed become a great club.

John was born in Paisley in Scotland in 1951 and he lived there for the next 20 years until he got married.

He did most of his early schooling in two schools - Bushes Primary until 1963 and Stanley Green Secondary until 1966. His first competitive soccer started at primary school but, of course, like most kids in Scotland, his soccer really began in the backyards of tenements in Paisley. He played school soccer from 7 years old until he left at 15.

John only had two jobs in Scotland before coming out here. He left school in 1966 and started a five year apprenticeship as an engineer, then in 1971, he worked as a turner for a couple of years.

While he was at secondary school in 1965, John met Beth for the first time. They parted again a year later when John left school, and it wasn't until three years later that they met up again at Ried Kerr Technical College - this time permanently. Late in 1971 they were married in Paisley and moved to Bridge of Weir to live.

John didn't have much involvement in soccer during these years - unless you can count standing on the terraces at Ibrox watching Rangers [Celtic supporters probably wouldn't regard that as real involvement].

It was all too much for John in 1973 - Celtic were heading for their 8th league title in a row! He just had to get away from it all and what better place than the other side of the world. In February 1973, he and Beth set sail for Australia.

They lived with relations in Ferntree gully when they first arrived out here, prior to settling in Noble Park, and John got a job as a turner. He also started playing soccer again, with Ringwood City Whilhelmena and he was with them during the 1973-74 seasons until he was forced to give it away because of an injury.

In 1975, John and Beth finally settled in Frankston and it was the next year that he became involved with Karingal United. Funnily enough, his first game at Ballam Park was AGAINST Karingal, when he played for Cranbourne Old Boys [starting as a club] in a friendly. He began playing for our seniors soon after and went through the whole season. The next year, 1977 he was assistant reserve player/coach with Kurt Schroeder, and then in 1978, he was a reserve player.

About that time, John changed jobs again as purchasing officer with Davey Pumps, then 18 months with Eliza Tinsely prior to his present position as purchasing officer with Peters Ice Cream.

His playing days apparently over, John's involvement with the club continued - as assistant secretary in 1978-79, club manager 1979-80 [he was first to hold this position] and presently as assistant club manager. Not content with that, he also coaches our Under 7 side.

John and Beth have three children - Iain aged 6 [plays for the Under 7's], Laura aged 4 and Andrew aged 2.

John feels that if we promote junior soccer [especially our under 14 and under 15], provide a successful senior team for these older boys to aim for, and keep a strong social side of the club [e.g. darts, family nights etc.] Karingal United will definitely prosper in the future.

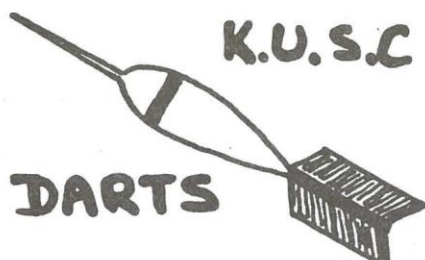
