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PLAYER PROFILE

TOM WEIR.

It is always exciting in soccer to watch a full back who attacks deep into the opponents half, and this has been very much Tom Weir's style of game over the past three seasons. This year has probably been his most successful and hopefully he will be back with us next season to carry on this success.

Tom was born in Newry, County Down, N.Ireland in 1948 and he didn't move from there for the next 24 years when he finally came to Australia.

In 1952, he started school at Newry Primary School, then nine years later moved to the Newry High School. His soccer career started at school and in 1961 he was playing in the local district junior competition. During his last two years at High School, he was also a member of the school team.

Tom left school in 1967, and took up a career as a draftsman with a Newry firm of architects and town planners. At the same time, he carried on his studies on a part-time basis at the Milford College of Technology in Belfast. His soccer did not suffer with all this work and study and for the next four years he played in the Mid-Ulster League.

While still living in Ireland, in 1969, Tom met his wife, Sandra, and two years later, in 1971, they were married. The young couple soon became restless for a new life and within a year, in August 1972, they travelled to Australia and settled in Melbourne. With his previous training, Tom had no trouble getting work, and started right away as a draftsman with the architectural firm of Eggleston, Macdonald and Secomb. He was with them for about a year, then moved to Milton Johnston and Partners [Engineers]. In 1976, he joined his present firm - Pelo Innes Neilson and Kosloff [Architects].

Tom got back into soccer in 1973 and had four good seasons with Caulfield City in the 3rd Division Metropolitan League. He gave it away for a couple of years before coming to Karingal United Soccer Club in 1979, and since then has been very much part of the club's recent successes. Last season, playing under coach Jim Logan, he was part of the team that finished a highest ever 5th in the league. This season, under coach Nigel Bevis, the team finished even better at 3rd place, and Tom was the regular full back. Next season promises to be even better and hopefully Tom will be part of the success again.

Sandra and Tom have three children - Duncan [5], Amber [3] and Greg [18 months]. With two young boys there is every chance that Tom will be involved in Junior soccer at Karingal in the years to come.

Tom says that he has enjoyed his soccer at Karingal [despite getting his leg pulled a lot, but after all, it is not his fault that he is Irish!] and wishes the club good luck in the future.

HOW TOM SEES THE FUTURE OF K.U.S.C.

Tom feels that we should make promotion next year provided we get everyone together early for a good pre-season work out. It makes it a lot easier if we can knock over those vital opening games of the season. He believes the club should somehow attract more players in the 15-20 year group which would give us a little more depth for the future. Perhaps they should be introduced into the seconds but he feels this would require playing them continuously, win, lose or draw. It would be fruitless to give them a run and then drop them the next week.

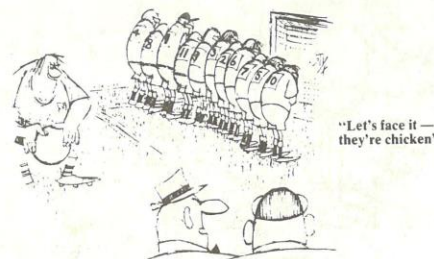

Also I think, after seven years with one Club, he felt the need to get out and widen his scope by joining another Club, namely, Frankston City. There is no glamour in joining the Club, as the team has to travel all over Melbourne and as far as Geelong, so they would need to be keen players to make these tedious journeys. Andrew is gaining more experience from playing with another Club and maybe more skills and who knows, he will be back again after a year or two, fully satisfied that Karingal is, after all, the best Club to play for. They will not be the boys who leave and come back again. By then, they will be young men ready to play for the Reserves or Seniors and all the better for it, so please understand their point of view, and hopefully gain from the benefit of their experiences.

CLUB PERSONALITY DOUG DARVILLE

It must be a rare distinction to be a founder member of a soccer club and then 14 years later still be holding on to that membership. Doug Darville is such a person and it looks like he could still be with us for some years to come. Let's hope so, anyway.

Doug was born in Hendon, North-West of London in 1929. Three years later he and his family moved to nearby Finchley and he lived there right up until he moved to Australia.

His schooling was all at local schools, St. Marys for three years and Manorside for seven years and then, in 1943, while the war was on, he left school, at the age of 14, and started working for a building contractor. This wasn't for too long though, because in 1947 he was called up to serve his National Service in the R.A.F. Bomber Command.

There were other things happening to Doug's life during these years. He started playing soccer at school in 1942 and he carried this through his years in the R.A.F. In 1946, he met his wife, Betty at her sixteenth birthday party and four years later they were married in Holy Trinity Church, East Finchley.

After leaving the RAF, Doug went to work for another building contractor, and then in 1960 he decided to go out on his own and went into the building maintenance business.

Early in 1965, it must have seemed like a mass exodus from U.K. when Doug, his wife, five small children and mother and father-in-law all moved to settle in Australia. They lived in Beaumaris for six months before finally settling in Frankston.

Doug worked at the Crib Point Refinery for a time, but soon went back to being self employed in 1967. The following year, he joined T.B. Transport and he has been with that company ever since.

It didn't take Doug long to get involved in soccer and in 1967 he was one of the foundation family members of Karingal United Soccer Club. Over the next few years, along with a few others, he helped to build our club into the success it is today. Never one to seek any recognition, Doug didn't take on any official position with the club in the early years but preferred to do most of his work in the background.

In 1975, he went on the social committee and worked diligently with them right through until 1978. Anyone involved with the club during these years will know just how hard Doug did work. He received the just recognition for this in 1977 when he was given the Best Clubman Award. Due to other commitments, Doug dropped out of the social committee at the end of 1978 but since then he has always kept up his membership, watches most senior home games and attends social functions whenever he can.

The other members of Doug and Betty's family are Jeanette [29], Susan [27], John [25], Stephen [22] and Douglas [20], and at some time or other over the years all three boys have been involved with the club. Douglas played for a couple of years, Stephen has been playing since he was 11 years old and at present is a member of the senior/reserve squad, and John has been helping out a lot around the clubrooms and behind the bar.

Doug believes that we have got a great future with the excellent sporting facilities that we have. The Seniors have already made their mark felt in soccer in Victoria and can look ahead to a great future, but he thinks that maybe there should be more family involvement for the junior teams.

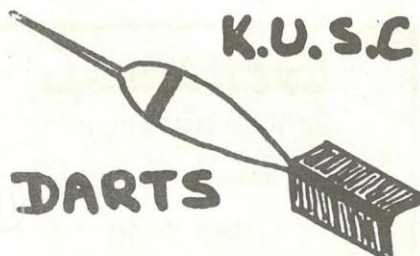

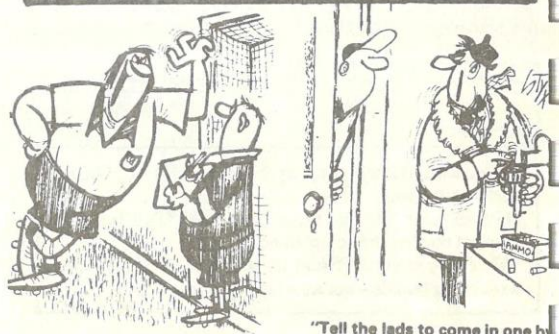
