The 1st two matches for this season have produced moderate results, with a good home win against a poor Lalor Team and a draw away at Langwarrin in the Annual Derby. What we have attempted to do for 1982 season seems to be paying off, in the form of two excellent wins of 5-1 and 4-1 by the reserve side. 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Only in his second season with Karingal United and yet Alan Parrott has already made his presence felt both on and off the field and at senior and junior level.

Born in London in 1948, Alan lived there for the next 21 years right up until his departure for Australia. He attended various schools and, like so many other boys in England, started playing soccer there. He had quite a bit of success too, representing his school, the district and also the County (Surrey).

This success carried on after he left school and it was not long before Alan was snapped up by the successful Isthmian League side, Sutton United. He followed this up later with a spell with Epsom and Ewell in the Athenian League. Another claim to fame about this time was playing in a Representative game against the famous "T.V. All-Stars" which included such names as Jimmy Hill, Danny Blanchflower and Johnny Haynes.

1969 was a big year in Alan's life. He turned 21 in the February and then made the big move to Australia, settling right away in Frankston. He soon got a job as a sales representative, and then in August, he capped it all off by marrying Barbara.

Alan wasn't long in Australia before he got back into soccer again and in that first year he joined Frankston City for the start of a four year spell. During his final season with them he took out the "Best and Fairest Award", and he was also included in the Victorian Squad when Glasgow Rangers toured here.

In 1973, he was transferred to Footscray JUST and in the next five years with the State League side, he won a number of medals and awards - Ampol Cup Winners Medal; Dockerty Cup Winners Medal; 3 State League Cup Winners Medals; Best and Fairest (1976). He left there in 1978 and after spells back with Frankston City, then with Skye Rovers, he joined Karingal United for 1981 season.

Meantime, Alan had become State Sales Manager with his Company, a position he still holds. Barbara and Alan have four children - Adam (11), Simon (9), Luke (5), and Sarah (16 months) and at present both Adam and Simon play for Skye Rovers (both teams coached by their Dad!).

This season Alan was appointed our Director of Junior Coaching, and when asked how he saw the future of our club, the importance of juniors to him was very apparent. He believes that Karingal has made the transition from Junior to Senior soccer in a professional manner, and if we can retain the hard working people within the club, and continue the policy of developing our own juniors, the club must grow stronger. "The Club is the people".

Last season, Alan was an important part in the success of our club. He is back with us again for a second year, and already indications are that he will be helping us to even greater success.

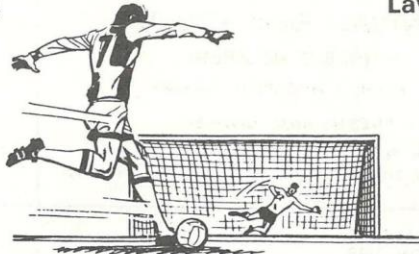

LAWS OF PLAY

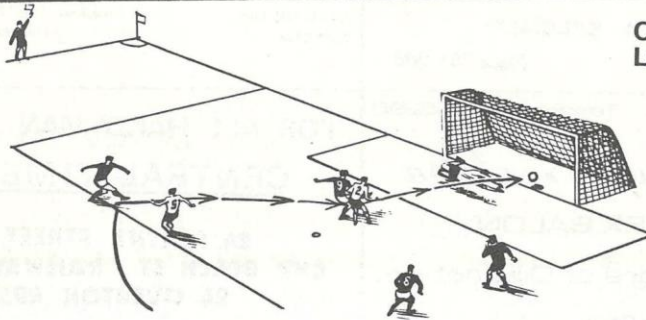
PENALTY-KICK Law 14

If the goalkeeper moves before the penalty-kick is taken will the Referee stop the kick?



No. He will await the result of the kick. If a goal is scored it will be allowed. If not the kick must be retaken. (See Decision No. 3b).

OFF-SIDE Law 11



The ball is passed to No. 9 who is standing in line with defender No. 2. No. 9 is off-side because he is in front of the ball and had only one opponent (the goalkeeper) nearer the goal-line when the ball was played.

FOULS AND MISCONDUCT Law 12

Fair charge.



An example of a **fair charge**, shoulder to shoulder, ball within playing distance, arms and elbows tucked in.

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CLUB PERSONALITY TERRY ALLSOPP

Our senior teams depend so much on the coach and manager and they in turn need the help and guidance of the senior - vice- president. Terry Allsopp was the popular choice for that position this year and as expected he is doing the job to everyone's satisfaction.

Terry is a Londoner. Born in the Northern suburb of Tuffnel Park in 1940, he didn't stray too far from there over the next 29 years, living for spells in Tuffnel Park, Highgate, Hornsey, Kentish Town and Loughton in Essex.

He attended various schools in these areas until 1954, then he left to start a four years apprenticeship as a tool maker. He completed that, and followed it up with several jobs in the building industry and various driving jobs.

In 1961, Terry and Gladys were married in All Saints in Highgate, and to mark this great occasion Tottenham took out the League and Cup double.

The following year, he joined Ozalid, U.K. as a supervisor and for three years while he was with them he attended East Ham Technical College.

Terry often dreamt of playing for Tottenham while he was in U.K. but his only claim to glory was being able to play alongside the famous Rod Stewart in the local team called Redwines. Arsenal spotted him and were eager to sign him up, but Terry refused to drop the standard he was playing!

Tottenham didn't win anything in 1969, so Terry and Gladys decided it was time to leave England and move to Australia. He transferred to Ozapaper as production manager, living for a short time in Cheltenham before settling finally in Frankston.

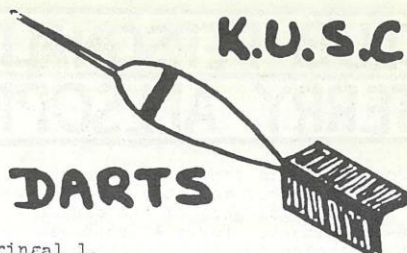
