- (g) players insurance \$1,600
- (h) darts boards, first aid kits \$200

Let's not forget a mortgage payment \$720, and telephone account \$80.

That's about \$8,000, all paid out or due to be paid out during March, April and May. It doesn't end there either. There are a lot more expenses to come before the end of the season. It all might seem incredible, but these figures show just where the money does go.

There's no problem though. Fortunately we have a budget conscious executive committee who examine and re-examine every item of expenditure before it gets approval. If all the members keep working and pulling together Karingal United Soccer Club will always be financially sound.

As a matter of interest, the total amount that will come in from members subscriptions during the whole year is about \$3,500.

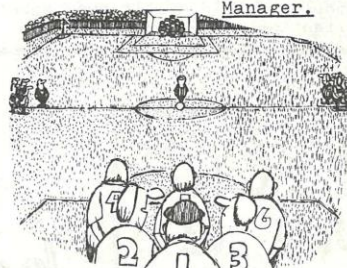

COACH'S COLUMN

The second report for this season finds both Senior Teams in a very healthy situation, with the first team level top and unbeaten, and the Reserve Team on top. Certainly, at this stage of the season it looks very healthy indeed; however, as the league settles down, it may mean that the top sides all come in a row in the Merry Month of May. If that is the case then it will be very important to get the most from the following five games with Ballarat, Rosanna, Hawksburn, Shepparton and Hawthorn. The remaining two games for the first half being bottom sides Nunawading and South Yarra. Should we achieve say, 8 points from these five games and wins against the bottom pair, then turning the season with 22 or so points will find us right on course for promotion or a League Title. I am confident that the current playing staff can do it, remember we can increase playing strength when Russell Bexon becomes available in June. Andy Taylor returns this week to bolster our weakest area, attack and should provide necessary punch and aggression currently left up to Sam Jordan and Brian Clothier.

The first team defensively looks the soundest we've seen in two years with remarkable young talent at centre back and sweeper in Ritchie Armstrong, 17, and Nigel Plaskett at 22. Dave Sharp and Bob Brickley both considerably older, provide excellent stability at full back with Dave being continually defensive, and leaving Bob to do the overlapping on one side only. Midfield shows an excellent mix of Alan Parrott and Peter Bourne as playmakers, and Steve Cargill and Ian Lesslie providing the pace and workrate giving good balance up front. Peter Bourne after a great start, is now suffering from the nagging injuries that dogged him last season, but this is where club depth comes in with excellent alternatives in Andy Taylor, Roy Brooks and Tommy Weir to provide healthy competition for places.

The Reserve side under John Black, seems likely to break all records, average almost 4 goals a game and should win Karingal's 1st title at a canter. Superb midfield work from Tony Mackay and Billy Jara provides most of the action that is a delight to watch before the 1st team game.

In summary I hope I can be writing as happily as I am now in a months time for the next report.

PLAYER PROFILE

JOHN BLACK

Our Reserve team is having one of its best season's ever and while a lot of the credit must go to the players themselves, equally the team coach deserves his fair share of the accolades. John Black is in his first year as player/coach and already his wide experience in soccer is having it's affect on the team's performances. With John at the helm, the Reserves can certainly look forward to even more success in the coming months.

John Black was born in Belfast, Nth. Ireland just after the war in 1946. He lived in that city for the next 17 years before moving to the seaside resort of Bangor where he lived out the years before coming to Australia.

He attended two schools in Northern Ireland, firstly the Botanic Secondary then the Belfast Technical College. His soccer career also started at school and he played his first competitive games there in 1955. In the following six years he played in the school team and in two of these years he also played for the Representative Schools District team.

In 1961, at the age of 15, John left school and started work as a cargo superintendent in the Port of Belfast. That same year his soccer career began to blossom out and he had trials with Crusaders in the Irish League. In 1962, he joined Civil Service in the Amateur League, transferred to Bangor in the Irish League in 1964, and finally, in 1966, moved to St. Elizabeth in the Amateur League.

Away from soccer, John got married in 1970 to Annette in the town of Millisle, County Down, and a few months later, early in 1971, they both left Ireland and travelled to Australia to make a new life. Within a month of arriving, John had got himself a job as supervisor with Coca-Cola Bottlers, and he also got back into soccer joining Juventus in the State League.

The next few years saw John playing for Springvale City (2years) and Frankston Pines (3years) before coming to Karingal in 1978. He played two seasons with our seniors, spent a year as Vice President Social, played for Chelsea in the Bayside League for a year, and came back to Karingal this year as Reserve player/coach.

Annette and John now live permanently in Frankston, having moved from Mentone in 1974. John left his job as assistant warehouse manager for Coca-Cola in 1979 to take up his present position as distribution manager with Wynn Wine - growers. They have two children - Alistair (8years) and Kelly (6years) and already Alistair is making a name for himself playing two years out of his age with the under 10's.

John has very firm views of how he sees the future of the club. He believes it depends partly on the success of the respective teams - in particular the first eleven - but it is equally essential to continually monitor the performance of all juniors especially those who have aquired the natural talent and ability to be successful. Club members should give their total support not only to the players but also the executive decisions which ultimately determine the club's future.

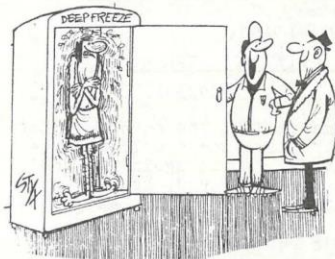
18th April: Our first league game away to Box Hill 'A'. Score Box Hill 2. Karingal 0. A very dissapointing game as far as Karingal were concerned.

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CLUB PERSONALITY

RON OWEN

There are not many of our present members who can boast almost continuous active involvement with our club for nearly 13 years. It's quite an endurance record to say the least, and Ron Owen has come through it all with flying colours. Now coaching his sons' team, the under 9's, there is every chance, hopefully for us, that his involvement will continue for some years to come.

Ron was born during the war in June 1941 in Streatham Hill, South West London and he lived there and in nearby Wandsworth for the next 27 years until leaving for Australia. He attended two local schools in the ten years between 1946 and 1956 - New Park Road Primary and Aristotle Secondary Boys School, and it was at school that he started playing soccer - as a right winger - when he was picked!

In 1956 at the age of 16, Ron left school and went to work right away in a drawing office. He didn't fancy that much, and joined up in the Merchant Navy with the Port Line. Funnily enough it was while he was in the navy that he first visited Australia - and vowed that he would NEVER want to live there! He left the Merchant Navy and went to work as a bus driver for London Transport for a time before becoming manager of the Great International Cleaning Company.

Ron did not play a lot of competitive soccer in U.K. In fact he claims his only success was playing right wing for England in the 1966 World Cup Final against West Germany - under an assumed name, of course!

Ron and Valerie were married in Southwark Registry Office in July 1961 and they set up house in Wandsworth. In 1968, they decided to have a complete change, and left England together for Australia.

When they arrived in this country, they settled in Elwood initially and stayed there for 2 years during which time they built their present house on Karingal. In 1970 they moved in.

It was about this time that Ron first got involved at Karingal. In 1970, he took on the job as coach of the under 10's after going through a coaching course, then coached the team as 11's, 12's, 13's, 14's, 15's and 16's. In 1977, he was coach of Frankston City 16 colts (our players) and took them to top place in the league. A year later he was Karingal Senior Coach.

At the start of the planning and building of our clubrooms, Ron was Founder President of the Building Committee and he held that post until it was completed. Some members will remember just how much time he spent on that work! Even today he is a member of the Co-op Directors.

1980 saw Ron back into coaching again with his son's Under 7 team and he has taken them through to Under 9's this year. Assuming his son, Mark goes right through to senior level, we could well see Ron being involved in the club for another ten years or more!

Ron is at present a sub-contractor, hiring and cleaning industrial laundry and he has been with the same company since his arrival in Australia. Valerie and Ron have two children - Gary (19) who went through our juniors into the seniors, and Mark (8).

Ron believes that Karingal has been and still is a successful club because we had a strong foundation as a junior club and this progressed into seniors. He believes we have strong leadership and he would like to see K.U.S.C. become a dominant senior side at the same time maintain a healthy junior club.

Come along and join us.

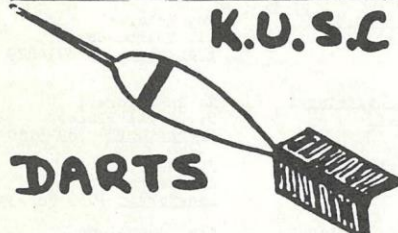
