Presidents Message:

This month there are two important matters which I would like to bring to your attention: Firstly, the lighting of our middle pitch is taking somewhat longer than we thought. This is mainly due to the high cost involved and our efforts to minimise this by utilizing offers of assistance to buy materials as cheaply as we can. Even with this help which is greatly appreciated the lighting when finished will cost approx. \$3000. I think you will agree this is a fairly significant expenditure.

However, when it is completed we will have much improved training facilities and the ability to hold night games which in themselves will produce additional revenue for the club. We would also like to finish the lighting so that we can turn our attention to the building of the canopy which will improve spectators comfort at matches. This project is estimated to cost us \$5000.

As you can see these are significant items of expenditure which have to be paid for from club revenues. This leads me to the second part of my report. It has always been our policy to be fairly conservative in the question of financial management of the club. Wherever possible expenditures such as that above are paid from current revenues and not by placing the club in debt. A lot of people work extremely hard in a number of ways to raise the necessary money for the basic running of the club and the improvements I have outlined.

One such area which is a major contributor to our club income is the sales conducted by the kiosk and clubhouse. Since it is a major contributor I think it might be wise to explain our philosophy on pricing in both areas.

In settling prices there are two objectives that we attempt to achieve. These are to charge prices which are reasonable in terms of value for money and secondly a price which will give some income to the club. Anyone who visits other clubs would know that the prices we charge are very comparable and give excellent value. So just remember when you buy something at our club you are getting value for money and also supporting the club's efforts to make Karingal a better club for both players and supporters of soccer.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

In last months issue of the magazine a short article entitled "Where does the money go?" appeared. The last paragraph mentioned the fact that total membership subscriptions would total about \$3,500. This figure is based on a membership of approx 250-300. At present we have taken approx. \$2500 in membership fees from approx 200 members. We have a playing staff of well over 200 spread between juniors and seniors and also the Bayside League. In addition we have members from 3 darts teams and some members simply to be associated with the club. This makes a total of almost 300 potential club members

From the figures it is clear that there are approx 80 people who are enjoying the facilities of the Club without having become members. Either they are playing in one of the clubs teams - soccer or darts, or their boy is playing in one of our junior teams. I consider this unfair on those who have become members. I ask you all to ensure that your membership is paid as soon as possible. It has not been club policy in the past to write to people, either past members or prospective new members, to inform them that fees are due. Maybe we should but we have never considered it necessary.

For those who maybe are unaware, the membership fees are \$14-50 single membership and \$25 family membership. In the case of junior players, a parent should become a member. If more than one boy in the family wishes to play then a family membership should be taken out by all those over 18 years of age who wish to play for the club or take advantage of the clubs facilities.

Payment can be made through your team manager, over the bar when open or by contacting myself or any Committee Member. Support us in what we are trying to do for you, the member, by ensuring that you are financial. Who knows that magical figure of \$3500 or if you prefer 300 members may be reached or even surpassed.

PLAYER PROFILE

TONY M'KAY

One of the pleasures of watching our talented Reserve Team this season is the excellent blend of youth and experience. Our youngsters are particularly fortunate in having the benefit of playing alongside someone with the wide experience, skills, cool temperament and sportsmanship of Tony McKay. He is a fine example for all the juniors and many of our seniors to follow.

Tony was born in Manchester in England in 1943 and he lived in the famous soccer city for the next 27 years. He attended a couple of local schools there - St. Clare's and St. Gregory's Technical - and it was at St. Clare's in 1953 that he first started playing competitive soccer - the U/11 team in the schools league.

He played soccer right through his remaining school years but even that was not enough. During his last two years at school, Tony actually played on Saturday and Sunday mornings and afternoons - 4 games per weekend - over 150 games a season! Also in 1958, he represented the Manchester Catholic Schoolboys.

Tony left school in July 1959 and got a job in C.W.S. as a trainee salesman. He kept on at his soccer as well and at the age of 17 had trial spells with Manchester United and Everton and then a season with Blackburn Rovers. It was while he was with this club that, in 1961, he toured Ireland with Blackburn Rovers Youth Team. The following year he had a season with Great Harwood in the Lancashire Combination. Unfortunately, that same year a broken leg in a "Pub" game ended his hopes on any major career in soccer.

In 1962, Tony joined I.C.I. as a laboratory assistant, stayed there a year, then moved to Connolly's Cables where he remained for the next six years. His job with them was supposedly to be in the engineers department, but, in fact, really entailed captaining and running the soccer team in a soccer crazy factory. During these years, the team won about 15 trophies including a national competition. The 1968 and 1969 season, also saw him captaining the Manchester Amateur League in inter-league games.

While he was working at Connolly's, Tony started going out with Catherine, who was working at the same place and, in fact, lived only a few hundred yards away. In June, 1970 they were married at St. Clare's Manchester, and two weeks later they sailed for Australia.

They quickly made Melbourne their new home, living in flats in St. Kilda and Elsternwick for a couple of years before moving to Frankston in 1973. They have had a couple of trips back to U.K. - 6 months in 1976 and 15 months in 1978, but have finally settled down in their present home in Mt. Eliza.

Tony has never had much trouble with employment. As soon as he arrived out here he got a job with T. & G. selling insurance. Six months later, he joined McDougalls (later taken over by Ozapaper) in the photocopying business. He stayed with them until 1977, had a six month spell with Wilkins Service before going overseas. When he returned in 1979 he joined UPS Copiers and then last year he started with his present firm Crusader Copiers in Mordialloc.

In all these years, Tony kept playing soccer and had spells with Dandenong City (1971), Frankston City (1972-75), Chelsea (1976) before coming to Karingal in 1977. This season playing mainly in the Reserve Team, Tony appears to be enjoying his soccer more than ever and he gets particular pleasure out of helping with the younger players in the team.

An important and happy event that has to be mentioned is the forthcoming birth of their first baby in November. Needless to say Catherine and Tony are eagerly awaiting the day.

Tony believes the future of the club lies with the progression of juniors into senior teams. There is a need for a further competition to allow the last junior age team to take the step into senior soccer - too many boys are lost to soccer in the 16-18 age bracket. Fortunately we have two or three lads in the Reserves who will mature to serve K.U.S.C. for many years and Tony personally gets great pleasure in helping these lads achieve a higher appreciation of the skills of soccer. He hopes to continue this work by both playing and coaching for many years to come.

Congratulations to Karen and Doug Beardsworth on celebrating their first wedding anniversary this month.

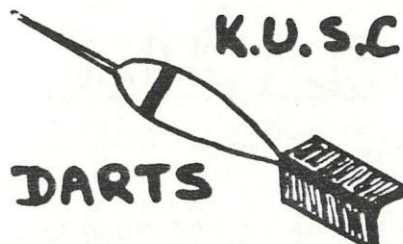
