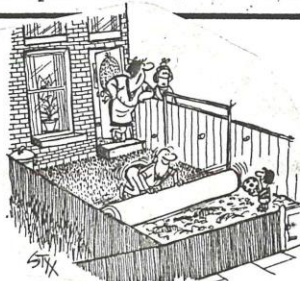
WANTED

Don't forget our Fancy Dress Night in August.

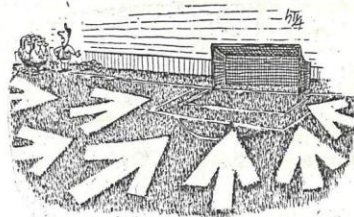

PLAYER PROFILE

BRUCE MITCHELL

Our Reserve team is having a tremendous season this year with only two defeats in fifteen games and an important part of this success must be the great form of Bruce Mitchell in goal.

Bruce was born in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1959, and he and his family lived in Waverley Park, Edinburgh until he was 9 years old. In that time, he spent 4 years attending Abbey Hill Primary.

In November 1968, the Mitchell family left Scotland and travelled to Australia to start a new life. They stayed initially in Maribyrnong, then South Oakleigh for a year before settling in the Pines area in 1970.

Bruce was still at school at the time and went to Aldercourt Primary for a couple of years. He also started playing soccer in 1970 for Chadstone juniors, then transferred to Peninsula, where he played for a couple of years until 1973. Living in the Pines area, he then decided to transfer to the local side, and he joined Pines juniors. While he was playing there, he won "best team man" for 1973 and 1974.

In 1976, Bruce completed his four years at Monterey High School and left to take up a job with Nylex. Also that year, at a Pines Soccer Club dance, he first met his wife Linda.

Now playing senior soccer, Bruce moved clubs again in 1977 and joined Chelsea in the Metropolitan league. A couple of seasons with them, then it was back to Pines again. In 1980, he won a Reserves League Championship medal when Pines Reserves won the 3rd Division Metro League title.

Bruce also changed jobs in 1980 and started with R.W.M. where he is still working today.

Last season, Bruce moved to Karingal. He had a mixed first season with the Reserves, but this year he has really come into his own. Playing with complete confidence, conceding very few goals, he is probably having his best ever season and is definitely a major part of the overall success of our seniors this year. In the recent game against Lalor, Bruce won a well deserved "man of the match" award.

Bruce has three brothers living in Australia, and two of them involved with soccer. Colin Mitchell is a well known player in the area and is at present playing for Frankston City after a number of years with Pines. Tom Mitchell, a keen Pines supporter, will always be seen around Frankston or Karingal when his team is playing away.

Bruce and Linda do not have any children at the moment, but Bruce assures us that they are working on it!

A good clubman for Karingal, Bruce would like to see the club doing well in the Metro League, but first and foremost he would like to see our Seniors and Reserves both winning their leagues this year. You can be sure, he will be doing his part in trying to make this happen.

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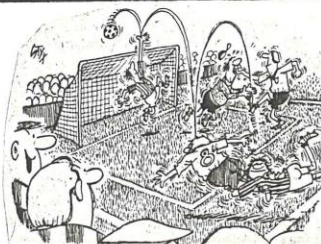
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CLUB PERSONALITIES

ETHEL DUPREY

MARGARET MORAN

Working the kiosk every Sunday without fail, attending most functions, usually first up for a dance, and always cheery and friendly - Ethel Duprey maybe one of our clubs older members but there is no doubt she is certainly one of our liveliest.

Ethel was born, the thirteenth child in a family of fifteen brothers and sisters, in 1906 in the East End of London. She was actually christened Thirza, but Ethel became her adopted name.

Her early years were all spent living in the East End. She attended several schools in the Poplar area until she left at 14 to go into service. She worked at that for about a year, then followed a series of jobs - manual work in a biscuit factory (1922-24), making stewards smocks in a tent factory (1924-26), and making linings for coats in a furriers (1926).

It was while she was working there that she also taught herself to play the piano, and then was asked to play at parties. It was at one of these that she first met her husband.

Ethel kept on working hard - making raincoats (1926-27), working for Taylors, Tower Bridge Road (1927-30) and finally working in a fish-shop right up until she left England in 1971.

In 1931, at the age of 23, Ethel got married in All Saints Church, Poplar and a couple of years later she and her husband moved to live in Dagenham, Essex, where they stayed for the next 39 years. Ethel's husband was a steel erector.

When she had been married nearly 9 years, Ethel had an operation and afterwards the Doctor advised her to walk, swim and ride. The first two were easy but the last gave her some trouble. Apart from saddle cramp and at times walking bow-legged she never got the hang of the reins. On one occasion she even ended up guiding the horse into the sea and had to be rescued!

Ethel's husband was a keen West Ham supporter and in his early years won ten medals playing for the Railway.

In 1971, Ethel and her husband decided to lift their roots and move out to New Zealand to join their son Henry. They lived there for the next seven years until sadly her husband died in 1978 at the age of 75. They had been married 48 years. Ethel decided to go back to England but only stayed 18 months before coming back to Australia to settle near her daughters, Claire and Helen in Frankston.

Not long after she arrived here, Ethel got involved in our club and soon became the well known, popular and important member she is today.

Being wife of the club president is a big enough involvement in itself, but Margaret Moran has not let it rest there. A very active member of our social committee, working in the kiosk on Saturday afternoons and the mastermind behind the great success of the kiosk this year, there just doesn't seem to be a lot more Margaret could possibly do for our club.

Margaret was born in Willesden General Hospital in North London on 10th April one year! She and her family lived in Willesden until she was six, then Hampstead until she was fourteen and then finally in Cricklewood.

She attended several schools in all of these moves - Willesden Primary School, a small Church of England school in Hampstead, Parliament High Girls School and Whitefield Comprehensive School where she stayed until she left school at the age of 16.

Margaret's first and, in fact, only job in the U.K. was 18 months working as a shorthand typist for Remploy, and it was at this time that she first met Brian. It was a typical romantic setting - three boys and three girls meeting outside a Wimpey Bar! They met again a month or so later, went to the cinema and it was after the magic of sharing their popcorn that they both knew they were meant for each other.

In December 1962, they were married in Hampstead Registry Office and a short time later they moved to Reading in Berkshire where they stayed until they left England to come to Australia in 1966.

Margaret had no trouble finding work when they settled in Melbourne - typist for Remington Rand, secretary to assistant manager, L.O.O.F., secretary in the customs department of Phillip Morris, and now she works part-time for Coles New World as a contract driver.

Margaret first became involved with Karingal as a proud parent watching her sons playing in junior teams. In 1980, she worked on the social committee, last year she was assistant treasurer on the executive committee, and this year she has been working harder than ever on the social committee.

Apart from working, looking after her family - Geoffrey (19), Debbie (17), Paul (12) and Simon (9) - and her involvement with Karingal, Margaret doesn't really have much spare time on her hands,

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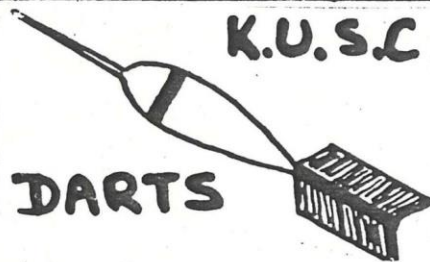
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KARINGAL 1 (Div 2 Captain T. Allsopp)
