Coaching courses are held in Victoria each year which anyone interested may attend.

What I'm trying to say is that you do not have to be an expert to volunteer your services to the club as a Manager or Coach. You need only have interest in the game and a desire to help the boys in the Club to learn to become better players.

Next year we will be running teams in all age groups from U7 through to U16, in some cases there will be two teams in the one age group. As you can see we are looking for at least 20 people to look after our juniors. If you are interested please get in touch with me at anytime, either by letter or phone. I would be pleased to hear from anyone who maybe interested in being part of the team next year. That by the way includes those Managers and Coaches who intend to carry on again next year.

COACH'S COLUMN

The 1982 season ended as it started with a flurry of goals from both teams. Watching the Reserves it became a habit, as no less than eighteen times they scored 3 or more goals. Alas it was a major problem with the first team as they conceded as little as anybody in the state, yet scored less than two goals a game on average, without a particularly defensive policy.

From the beginning we decided we would try to add depth of players in an attempt to gain consistency for the longer season ahead.

We gained many fine players but sadly very few in the attacking area. As it all comes out in the figures and statistics, the end revealed our problem and the resultant failure to gain promotion was by one point and five goals. One other contributing feature added to our demise, that of a bad injury period which affected our performance over a seven week period. Three of those players injured did not play again. Finally to all supporters, thank you for your support. I hope we have given you some fun, action and satisfaction during this memorable season.

JOHN BAIRD Goalkeeper. Despite residential difficulties which caused low training effort this young man had a brilliant season, strong, agile and sound, John gave us many terrific performances and some saves which were unbelievable. Possibly the league's best keeper.

DAVE SHARP Full Back (Midfield). Dave came to us having played reserve football at Shepparton the year before. He soon showed how wrong they were, with an excellent season at full back. A powerful tackler, loyal and dedicated to his team and his club. And the job at hand.

BOB BRICKLEY Captain and Full Back. Bob usually hits form half way through the season. Sadly a bad injury halted this season and cost the team a very important and determined player and captain.

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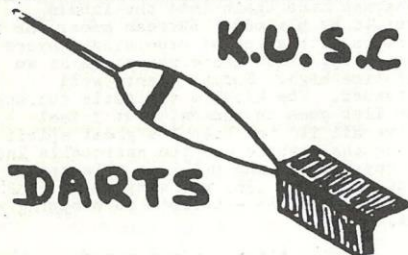
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KARINGAL 1: CAPT. G.LAMB (DIV 2)
