SECRETARY'S REPORT

The new season is now upon us and the club is all geared up to meet it. We are anticipating an even better season than the last one.

This year we should be fielding more teams than ever. We will be running teams in all junior grades from Under 7 to Under 16 - and in some cases more than one. We will, of course, have our two senior teams, which for the first time have entered the ranks of the Metropolitan League, and once again have two teams in the Bayside League at Ballam Park. These two teams are an entirely separate entity and must be treated as such, as they are outside the control of the Victorian Soccer Federation. But nevertheless they are an integral part of the club.

COMMITTEES

Having all these teams means that over the weekend - every weekend of the season - several teams will be found playing at Ballam Park on both Saturdays and Sundays.

It creates a few headaches for the club administration in ensuring that all matches are played.

This year, as always, we have a very active social committee who organise most of our fund-raising activities and provide us with some entertaining functions. We now also have a building committee who will be responsible for organising the extensions to our clubhouse which should be started during the year. Unfortunately the building of the canopy over the concrete area in front of the clubhouse

has had to be shelved temporarily. It would be inconvenient to put it up before the extension is completed.

We have managers or coaches - and in some cases both - for all our teams. But we would be interested in hearing from anyone who would like to help in this area.

I must comment on the weekend of 26th and 27th February. Firstly, the first team's performance on the Saturday, and then our registration day and fete on the Sunday. The first team had one of its biggest wins in some time - and against one of the teams in our league section, Ferntree Gully. What was especially pleasing in the 5-1 win was that 75 per cent of the Karingal players had come up through our junior ranks. This is a new milestone for the club.

RECORD

The fete was a huge success, and on the registration side we signed up more than 100 players and club members - a record for registration day.

In closing, I would like to welcome back all those members returning to us from last year or previous seasons. May you find the year rewarding for yourselves and your boys. To new members joining us for the first time I offer a special welcome. We are pleased to have you with us. You will find the magazine a source of interest and it will let you know what is happening in and around the club. I hope you will find us a happy and friendly club.

THE COACH'S COLUMN

The 1983 season starts this week and sees Karingal in its first Metropolitan League game. Promotion in each of the two previous seasons has put our club in a very healthy position in the local soccer community.

The goal we have set ourselves for the next few years is to establish Karingal as the leading club on the Peninsula. Improvements to facilities are already under way, and ground improvements will be completed early next year.

On the coaching side we will try to produce some talent from our own ranks, and we have been working heavily on that aspect of the playing staff over recent weeks. Fortunately, we have a very bright group of youngsters who I am sure will be future Karingal stars. The senior squad of 16 players has a 90 per cent content of players under the age of 24. This gives the advantage of producing a team that may stay together longer.

Probably the most significant happening for 1983 is the appointment of DAVE SHARP as assistant coach. Dave was one of United's key players last season, but has retired because of injury. We have been delighted with his coaching efforts so far. I am very pleased to say we share the same ideas about the game and of Karingal's future. I'm sure Dave will earn the same respect as a coach as he did as a player. He will be responsible for assisting the first team and be in charge of the reserve squad.

Changes in management due to Bill Keizenberg's retirement bring PETER McDONALD to the position of first team manager, JOHN TWEDDLE remains as reserve team manager, JACK SMITH moves into Peter's position as trainer, while JOE SMITH and 'UNCLE COLIN' continue to act as masseurs.

We are fortunate indeed to have such a happy and capable staff to look after these important areas. Bill Keizenberg, although retired, will continue to serve Karingal in his own inimitable way.

NEW PLAYERS

On the playing side we have seen a number of players leave our first team. Dave Sharp, Steve Cargill, Brian Clothier, Alan Parrott, Ritchie Armstrong. On the credit side several new faces will please Karingal fans. Red-headed Scot CHARLES SWEENEY will challenge old favourite Tommy Weir for his long-held title of the club's top sprinter. A former Frankston City midfielder and striker, Chas has an abundance of skill and is only 24. DAVE MEAD comes from Seaford to fill striker or centre-back positions. Big Dave, a Welshman, is a chef at the exclusive RACV Club in town and likes cooking up ways to score goals.

KEVIN BURROUGH, transferred from Frankston City recently, returns to his former club to rejoin many of his junior teammates. Kevin is a fast and skilful winger with State League experience and will thrill Karingal fans with his work in attack. Kevin is also 24.

BRIAN WHITBY, from Ferntree Gully, is a winger or full-back who joins us for his first season. Brian is from Birmingham and is a nippy player with neat ball skills who fits in well with Karingal's young squad.

Long-serving JIM HULL and 16-year-olds MARTIN MOORE and ANDREW DURIEUX have been promoted to the senior squad.

ANDY WRIGHT, another former Frankston City senior, will prove to be a very handy signing indeed. Still a teenager, Andy is a very powerful player in defence or midfield.

This is shaping up to be the most exciting of my three years at Karingal, and we have a wonderful opportunity of laying the foundation for the assault to the top of the Metropolitan divisions.

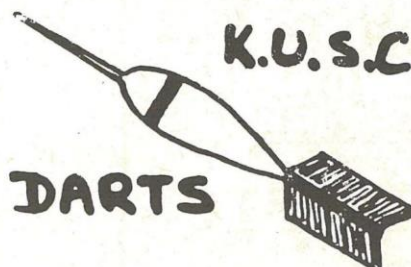
