30th July. Skye "B" 2, Karingal 7. Danny Burn played the game of the season, outwitting the Skye defence time after time to score 2 goals and set up chances for other forwards. Stephen Anderson (2), Daniel Docherty (2) and Matthew Kren completed the scoring.

6th August. Baxter "B" 0, Karingal 3. Once we adjusted to Baxter's off-side trap we were never in any danger. Craig Butler scored twice and Danny Burn netted a typical individual goal.

13th August. Karingal 3, Langwarrin 0. This was a real quality performance from the boys and proved they do play their best on dry grounds and against tough opposition. Langwarrin had lost only one previous match - and that was when we beat them 2-0, at Langwarrin. This time we made it 3-0, with Daniel Docherty scoring twice in the first half and Jason Valk in the second. It was our best team performance for some time, but a special word for Patrick Clancy, a newcomer to soccer this year who has made the right-back spot his own. He tackles strongly and holds his position well.

20th August. Peninsula 1, Karingal 2. The best match of the season and our most thrilling win. Peninsula was the only side we had not beaten, and we started the match without our two regular left-sided defenders, Matthew Kren and Scott Twaites. We went a goal down midway through the second half, but the boys continued to attack and got the goals our play deserved. We equalised through Stephen Anderson, and Lee Rochfort scored the winner in the dying seconds. Every boy really played hard in this match, but that extra effort was made by Stephen Anderson and Daniel Docherty in midfield and Gary Casham, who had his best game of the season on the right wing. The win almost guaranteed we will finish as champions.

As this is the final report for the season, it's time to have a look at the boys and see how they have handled their first year on a full-size pitch.

Every one of the boys who came through from the Under 8 squad did much better than I expected. They adjusted quickly to the larger pitch, and in the games against Langwarrin and Peninsula played a standard of soccer I would not have expected for another 12 months. We have had our disappointments, though - to lose our unbeaten record to Baxter after being 2-0 up was a real setback.

The team spirit throughout the year has been marvellous. Our biggest strength has been our teamwork. Next season, when the boys develop their concentration even more, we should see an even better team.

SCOTT TWAITES was a much improved player this year and was a very valuable, determined full-back.

GARY CASHAM was another to make excellent progress, especially when he moved up to right-wing. Along with LEE ROCHFORD, in his first year with

Karingal, he made impressions with strong running at opposition defences.

Forwards CRAIG BUTLER and DANNY BURN both displayed ability to beat opponents and score goals.

JASON VALK returned to Karingal soccer after a year's break and was a consistent and valuable asset, tackling well and scoring goals.

We have three new players this season - PATRICK CLANCY, NEIL TREZISE and TRAVIS SHEARN - and all did very well. Patrick has made an impact at right-back, while Neil and Travis have helped the team out in several positions and will be pressing for regular positions if they continue to work at the game.

Left-half MATTHEW KREN would have been in the running for player of the year if he had not tried to play too far forward earlier in the season. Fortunately, he is now out of this habit and is again a tower of strength in defence, an excellent tackler alongside centre-half TYRONE POWER. Tyrone has held the defence together with his powerful and timely tackling and can be more than satisfied with his valuable contribution to the team's success.

Another reason why the opposition goalscoring has been so restricted is the goalkeeping of STEPHEN SHAW. Stephen has continued to develop his skills this year and would also have been in the running for player of the year if he had not missed five or six matches midway through the year.

This leaves two boys who have again had outstanding seasons, STEPHEN ANDERSON and DANIEL DOCHERTY, who must share the "player of the year" award for their skill, hard work and consistency. Stephen played midfield and often submerged his own talents for the benefit of the team. Daniel played mostly as striker in the inside-right position, scoring several goals, but also played well at sweeper when moved back to help the defence.
