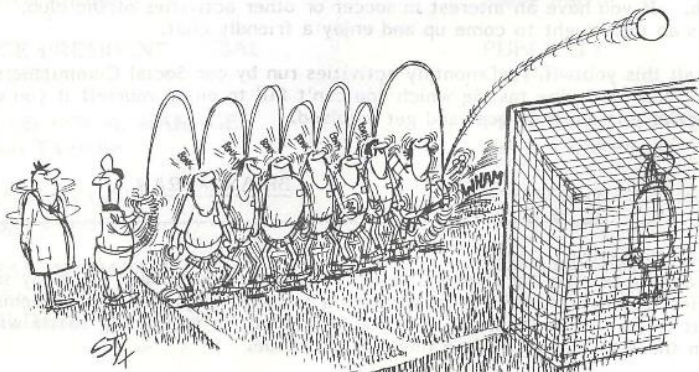
SECRETARY'S REPORT
