*** COACHES COLUMN ***

Three defeats in a row have seen the 1st Team slip from second place and in contention to sixth place behind a close group of teams gathered together for the run home over the last six games. Although our position and our long list of injuries will not make it easy to win 1st or 2nd place and subsequent promotion, we utterly refuse to concede defeat until it is mathematically impossible. All teams in the leading group have matches against one another providing more avenues of possibility should results fall correctly.

Our purpose is to finish as high up as possible (and 1st place is still obtainable) and get the team prepared for those glamour Cup games at the end of the season. We are in the last 16 in both the METROPOLITAN CUP and the DOCHERTY CUP and a good draw could see us progress as long as we can put the team back together again.

Unfortunately Mark Rees is very doubtful for the rest of the season due to a snapped hamstring, Andy Wright had a bad injury last week and must be doubtful for two weeks if not more just at a time when he was showing some of last years form. Ray Dunn and Glenn Barker have both suffered hamstring strains over the last few weeks and have lost fitness because of this. Kevin Moore should return shortly after a two week absence with a knee injury, and John Rowe returns this week after suspension for 4 yellow cards.

Referees this year seem to have yellow card mania and no less than 8 first team players are on the edge of being suspended and Andy Wright, John Rowe and Glenn Barker have already been suspended this season. Our two areas of receiving "cards" are due to DISENT (keep your mouth shut), and bad tackles on which I blame the competitive nature of our team. I certainly want our boys to remain competitive, but maybe some attention needs to be given to correct tackling methods.

Injuries and suspension have also had some results as we have been able to promote YOUNG RED DEVILS into both 1st and Reserve Teams for invaluable SENIOR experience, something the club has wished to achieve from the outset
