*****COACH'S REPORT*****

For my final report for the 1984 season, I regret to say that we did not quite achieve what we set out to do in some areas, whilst in some others we achieved quite a lot. After a brilliant preparation and start to the season which saw us win four pre-season Cup games, in most cases against opposition in a higher League than ourselves, and a first half of the season in which we finished in second place, and the Reserves in first, as well as beating both promoted teams, we fell away into mediocrity and performances well below par in an unbelievable second half of the season.

We were the team everybody was talking about, the interest continued as we moved from the daredevil young Frankston side, taking on and beating allcomers to a staggering change in fortunes causing some eyebrow raising results including a 6 - 0 thrashing by champions Hamlyn Rangers, on our own ground.

The reasons are obvious, a combination of injuries, suspensions, work commitments, etc. causing lack of enthusiasm after losses and low depth. For some ten weeks we had an average of three to five front line players missing, and in one case six (against Hamlyn). On that day we had a combined injury list over both teams of nine. Unfortunately, because of the Club's policy to employ youth, our resources are youngsters training to become seniors.

An admirable policy, and a brave one after moving up into such a League, and I'm certain we have gained extremely valuable experience for Jason Symonds (16), Craig Pase (16), Steve Wood (16), Martin Moore (17) and Gerry McDonough (16), all who have represented the First team this season and form the backbone of what Karingal may become in four to five years time.

When you consider Andy Wright, Glenn Barker, Tim Dillon, Kevin Moore and Keith Towers will only be in their mid twenties, whilst Kevin Burrough, Nigel Plaskett, Ray Dunn and Otto Leenstra will be at that time in the soccer players career where many players are at their peak, the 27 - 28 mark, the future holds promise.

Support also comes from many of the young Reserve team players who have done such a fine job to achieve a Second or Third place in a strong competition.

Steve Dobinson's 25 goals were all loudly cheered, Bernie McGuinness, Mark Dillon, Tony Boundy, Tom Millington and Gavin Dobinson have all performed admirably. Later in the season we were forced to include several under 16 and 15 players and discovered some excellent talent in Michael Taylor, Chris Lymer, Andy Astfalck, Craig Millar and in particular young Jim Millar whom I predict will be a top First teamer within the next two seasons.

The player credits cannot be completed without mentioning the talents of the 'old brigade', three of them, Mark Rees who's sad exit with a snapped hamstring which was, I consider, a direct cause of our slide, John Rowe who has given the club a year of hard work in the First team attack, has been a superb example in training and added much personality to the club, and of course the evergreen Tommy Weir, who has had a great season with a young Reserve side and turned out week after week despite all the adversity when his own team was diminished by severe First team requirements.

I would finally wish to thank all players for a magnificent effort. With low resources we didn't win them all but we surprised many, and had an opportunity to win both Leagues.

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SUBSTITUTIONS

After three successive English Cup Finals were marred by one team losing a player through injury, substitutions came into the game with the general idea of players being changed when injured. Of course, when coaches got hold of this, opportunities presented themselves for tactical advantages with the changing and movement of players.

It took a long while for the local Australian Rules to adopt the substitutes laws or 'interchange' players as they call them. The Aussies of course went one better, allowing players to come on and off at will, but at least they haven't gone as far as the Americans with whole defences and attacks changing as in 'grid' iron or even whole teams as in Basketball.

Substitutions are an advantage in the respect of exercising the squad and using the full thirteen players on your team sheet, giving them all a weekly taste of the Real Thing, or trying out a youngster perhaps.

Often the reason for a player being substituted is a tactical one, adding speed in an area where the opposition is slow or height if it is an asset, or to give opponents fresh problems. Almost always tactical substitutions are made in attack or midfield, hardly ever in defence. Nor do you see two substitutions at the same time, unless maybe the game is almost over and the opportunity is taken to give two of the lads a run.

So, what's to come, still only one substitute is allowed in Europe, except in International Championships where two or five and sometimes three are available. I feel some advantage may be gained by being able to 'interchange' players and so 'spread the load' and put players back on because no player likes 'getting the hook' and no coach likes giving it.
