Clubs Future - providing the club can continue and extend its current youth policy the State league is well within sight. The importance of good organisation and administration cannot be stressed hard enough.

COACHES REPORT

For our second magazine, I have the pleasant duty to report that so far we are unbeaten in all eight matches, the two senior teams have played, these include a State League side Albion Rogers 2-1 (Docherty Cup) a First Division side (Nunawading 3-0) Metro Cup. A Second Division side, Eltham 5-2 (Metro Cup) and Provisional Leaguers Keysborough 5-0 Docherty Cup and, of course, two league matches thus far Brighton 3-1 and Yallourn 2-1.

The pleasing aspect is that despite heaps of missed chances, by many players, we have still scored consistently high (average 3.3 per game). To score at that level you have to be creating chances, and that we are doing in plenty. The high work rate of our forward group (John Rowe, Kevin Moore, Glenn Barker, Martin Moore, Kevin Burrough) put lots of pressure on defences and we are capitalising on that by keeping the ball forward as often and as quickly as possible. All our midfield players are teenagers, Craig Pase and Jason Symonds are 16, Andy Wright and Glenn Barker 19, Martin Moore 17 and perhaps lack of experience, but they are compensating by hard running, capable passing and supporting the forward trio as soon as the ball goes forward, resulting in goals for Glenn (3) and Martin (4). The back four (Keith Towers, Jim Hull, Nigel Plaskett and Kevin Iles) are providing safety and two different types of build up from either full back (long and short) and no nonsense down the centre. It all makes for a very attacking game, and we hope an entertaining snectacle.

We have always required support in the defensive area and have recently added Ray Dunn (FB and Otto Leenstra (CB & FB) both from Mornington to the senior squad. Whilst Steve Wood another 16 year old completes the group for experience, not forgetting of course, the excellent form of 18 year old Tim Dillon in goal.



RED DEVIL RESERVES

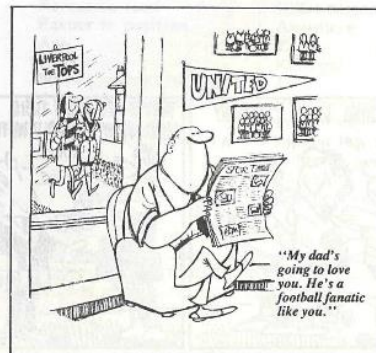

Coach Norm Wood is confident that his charges will continue to produce entertaining soccer all season.

Last week we were away to Bulleen and in the shadows of the Taj Mahal of Victorian Soccer, the Veneto Club, our lads were opposed by a very fit, experienced and strong team. Equal to the occasion our lads attacked tirelessly and in a very fast match play fluctuated from end to end. Then it came, a crossed ball by Steve Wood and a goal much to the delight of KUSC supporters and the dismay of Bulleen who threw everything at our youthful side in tide after tide attack. For every thrust by Bulleen we countered and we surely had our opponents rattled. When, whilst a promising attack mounted was halted by a foul in the penalty box and a penalty kick awarded to Karingal. But a goal was not to be and the players went in at half time with a 1-0 lead.

The second half really showed what our Red Devils were made of. With the breeze blowing up and favouring the home side, we spent most of this half defending and to the lads credit they held Bulleen scoreless. Attack after Attack was repelled and the final score, Karingal 1 Bulleen 0.

Congratulations boys you showed a maturity for beyond your years and it was an effort that all supporters were proud of.

I would like to wish everyone a very successful season, but more importantly I hope that every boy will enjoy his games and that he is happy at Karingal. I also hope that parents will continue to support both their sons and the club throughout the season and that they bring any constructive suggestions and criticisms to the notice of the committee so that we can try to improve the club for everybody's benefit.

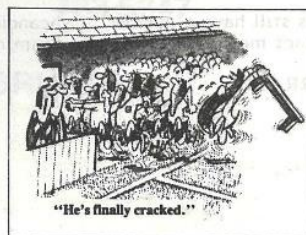
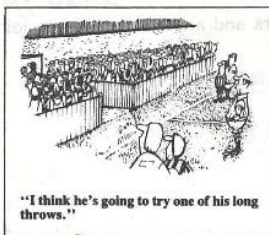
