COACHES COLUMN

This report for our next match against Geelong at home, brings with it, the bitterness of defeat. In twelve years of senior coaching, I still hate the very taste of defeat, aggravated as well by the tremendous run that we have had prior to the defeat by Essendon.

Eight games in all before we faltered, and the dropping of a point at Bulleen was probably a pointer that we were to fall soon. It is perhaps good in a way that we can relax and start a new run, (our record run is 11 undefeated games last season), because the longer a run is, the more tension builds up. So today is the start of another winning run. Those who don't mind being beaten are not true competitors, which I believe all our senior players are.

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SUB JUNIORS AND OTHER NOTES

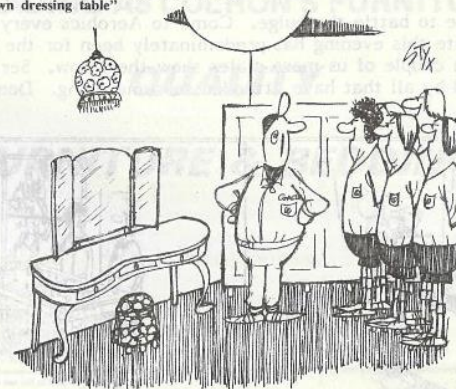
