LAW CHANGES FOR 1985

In order to avoid players crowding and jostling when a ball is dropped in the six-yard box or when an indirect-free-kick has to be taken in the same area the International Football Association Board has made the following Law changes effective from January 1st, 1985.

1. Law VIII. The Start of Play.

(d) After any other temporary suspension; when restarting the game after a temporary suspension of play from any cause not mentioned elsewhere in these Laws, provided that immediately prior to the suspension the ball has not passed over the touch or goal lines, the Referee shall drop the ball at the place where it was when play was suspended, unless it was within the goal area at that time, in which case it shall be dropped on that part of the goal area line which runs parallel to the goal-line, at the point nearest to where the ball was when play was stopped. It shall be deemed in play when it has touched the ground; if, however, it goes over the touch or goal lines after it has been dropped by the Referee but before it is touched by a player, the Referee shall again drop it. A player shall not play the ball until it has touched the ground. If this section of the Laws is not complied with, the Referee shall again drop the ball.

2. Law XIII. Free-kick.

Notwithstanding any other reference in these Laws to the point from which a free-kick is to be taken:

1. Any free-kick awarded to the defending team, within its own goal area, may be taken from any point within that half of the goal-area in which the free-kick has been awarded.

2. Any indirect-free-kick awarded to the attacking team within its opponent's goal area shall be taken from the part of the goal area line which runs parallel to the goal-line, at the point nearest to where the offence was committed.

As Vice President (Juniors), and on behalf of the K.U.S.C. Committee, I would like to extend a warm welcome to all old and new players, parents, coaches and managers. With the 1985 season almost upon us I am looking forward to another successful, enjoyable and interesting year.

At this stage it looks as if we will have teams in all age groups from U.7 to U.16, which will, again, make us one of the biggest clubs in the Junior League. Having teams is one thing, having coaches and managers is another. This year we are again most fortunate in having someone for nearly every team, but we still need a couple of managers and coaches to fill vacant spots. I congratulate these boys and know that not only will they carry the proud name of Karingal United into these teams but will also bring back a wealth of experience and skills which will be invaluable to themselves, their teams and the club.

Unlike many clubs which have "Junior" and "Senior" sections, we pride ourselves in being truly "United". Last year our junior teams played at half-time during senior games, acted as ball boys and gave our senior players loyal support. I hope that this will continue in 1985.

Maybe some of the older boys might like to watch the seniors at training this year too, and maybe team a little more. Bill Smith, our Senior Coach, has already indicated his desire to have senior players assist at junior training, matches, social functions, etc., whenever possible, thus confirming the "United" nature of our club.

We also hope to continue with the very successful McDonald's Super Skills Award scheme in which all players from the Under 7's to the Under 13's can take part and gain certificates and badges. The Red Devil Superstar Award will also be continued whereby players are awarded a certificate if it is considered, by the club, that they have made a significant contribution to their team.

On the social side I believe our new Social Committee will organize even more activities than in 1984. To you young players I wish you a happy and successful season. Work hard at training, try to improve

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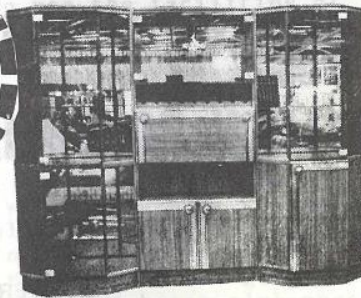

your skills, support your team, be punctual, be polite and, above all, enjoy yourselves during the games.

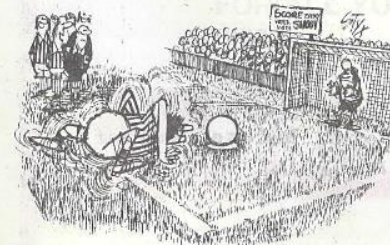
