It was with some regret that the decision was made to relieve Bill Smith of this position, as Bill, who joined the Club at the beginning of this year with high hopes and ambitions, has proved to be a most popular and supportive club member.

However, the First Team's position, deep in the relegation zone, and the apparent lack of commitment by the players to the team effort caused the Match Committee to decide to make the change. It is pleasing to see that despite these events Bill is still active in the club and we hope that he will continue to do so.

Our new Senior Coach is Tom Entwistle, who obviously has a very difficult task ahead of him, and hopefully he will get the full support of all players and supporters in the bid to avoid relegation.

Tom has been around the soccer scene for quite a number of years and played semi-professionally in Lancashire before coming to Australia in 1971, where he first played for Doveton, winning Reserve Best and Fairest that year. He went on to coach the team from 1974 to 1977, in which year Doveton won the 2nd. Division double. Tom was then appointed Senior Coach at Seaford when that Club was first formed, winning the League Championship in 1978 and 1979, and last year coached the Pines Under 18 team in the N.S.L. Youth League.

It must be very disappointing and frustrating for our supporters, who over the last few years have been accustomed to watching a successful side, to see the Red Devils in their present lowly position. However, all is not yet lost and with more determination and effort, both on match days and at training we can be confident that the team can avoid the drop back to Fourth Division and come back strongly next year.

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*****TEN COMMANDMENTS FOR PARENTS*****

1. THOU SHALT NOT ENCOURAGE THY LAD TO SCORE GOALS BY THE PAYMENT OF FILTHY LUCRE.

The real reward from playing soccer is simply to enjoy the game. Losing or winning are largely incidental.

2. THOU SHALT NOT RAVE, SHRIEK, SCREAM OR RAGE, OR OTHERWISE MISBEHAVE, FROM THE SIDELINES DURING A MATCH.

Parents can, and should, inspire the team ("Come on, Karingal", "Well played, Karingal", etc.) in a civilised manner. Encourage good attitudes of behaviour by example.

3. THOU SHALT NEVER CRITICISE THY LAD, NO MATTER WHAT THE RESULT OF A GAME.

Where a team has lost, not a single member of the team NEEDS to be told they did not play too well - for they will know only too well. Always try hard to find something to praise, to encourage.

4. THOU SHALT NOT CRITICISE THY COACH.

Coaching can often be far from an easy task. Remember - when a team wins well, the team usually receives the praise. But when a team loses it is often the coach who is blamed. Tolerance, support and understanding is required.

5. THOU SHALT NOT "ADVISE" OR "COACH" A LAD FROM THE SIDELINES.

During a game, allow the team to play as they see it should be. Rarely can a lad hear properly, any shouted extraneous "advice" during a game, and it will more than likely cause some confusion.

6. THOU SHALT FULLY SUPPORT THY COACH IN ALL HE DOES.

Encourage him to take a fully active part in the Club's activities, attend meetings, coaching courses, etc. Your team will be the real beneficiaries.

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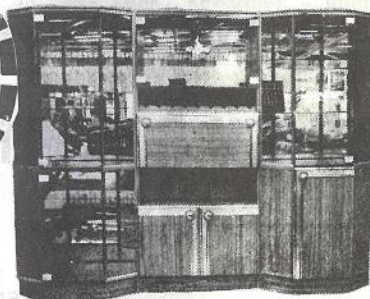

7. THOU SHALT MIGHTILY ENCOURAGE THY LAD IN THE CONCEPTS OF SPORTSMANSHIP AND FAIR PLAY AT ALL TIMES.

Soccer is an extremely fast game, requiring a high degree of skill concentration and intelligence. Where incidents occasionally do occur, respect by the lads for the Referee's and Linesman's decisions - and other players - is vital. Shaking hands with the other team after a match is an excellent start.

8. THOU SHALT CAUSE THY LAD TO ALWAYS DESIRE TO TRAIN CONCIENTIOUSLY.

The hour or so devoted to coaching on weekday evenings is often more important to the lads' soccer than the weekend games, as this is where their levels of skill and expertise are developed.

9. THOU SHALT MIGHTILY ENDEAVOUR TO THOROUGHLY ENJOY THE LADS' SOCCER WITH HIM.

Strong support and encouragement by the parents for the lads, individually and collectively, can do so much to help develop the lads' self-respect and raise their levels of ability.

10. THOU SHALT SUPPORT THY CLUB TO THE BEST OF THY ABILITY.

For a few hours a month the Club needs YOUR support. Offering a strong community support commitment, the Club progresses with the ACTIVE help and encouragement of the parents.
