Having seen most teams train throughout the season and watched all of the age groups play I have seen players, coaches and managers all working hard to improve individual and team play, to weld a close knit team spirit and to foster good sportsmanship both on and off the park.

Club spirit has seldom been stronger. 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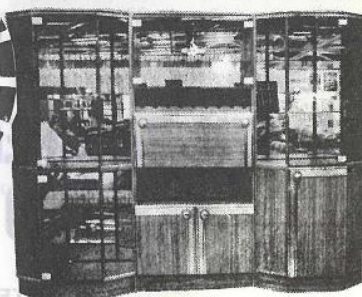
