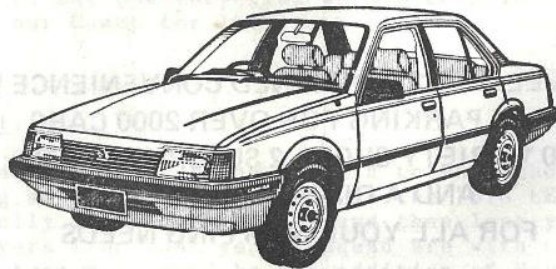

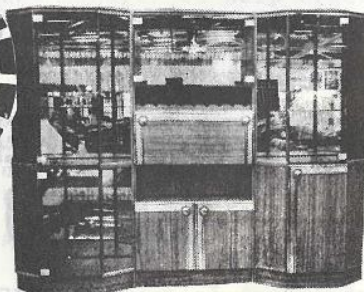

KARINGAL STORM HOME.

Karingal United began their 1985 campaign at home on March 23rd. with a game against Corio. Coach Bill Smith had warned the lads that Corio would be a tough side to beat, but neither Corio or a severe storm could stop the Red Devils from taking both points.

The game started badly for Karingal when, after only three minutes, right back Bernie McGuinness was injured in a tackle. Despite this set-back, Karingal pressured the Corio defence, and a probing run by Glenn Barker ended with a penalty to Karingal. Mario Hilli stepped up and put the spot-kick away at the second attempt after Corio's keeper moved too soon the first time.

Karingal's defence looked solid with Jimmy Hull and Keith Towers working well together and it was a good through ball from Hull to Barker which put Corio under more pressure with the ball just scrambled away for a corner. Karingal were well on top at this stage with goal attempts from Nigel Plaskett and Martin Moore keeping the Corio goalie on his toes. Andy Wright was substituted for the injured McGuinness just before half time.

The second half started with some heavy pressure from Karingal and a spectacular thunderstorm. However, it did not stop the lads from working even harder and a well timed through ball from Hilli put Barker through to score Karingal's second goal in the 55th. minute. From then on it was one-way traffic with the whole side working together. The final result was 2-0 to Karingal and a happy Bill Smith said afterwards "The boys did well, It's the first of many."

The Reserves game ended in a 3-3 draw after a game of changing fortunes. We were 2 down in the first half hour but Steve Dobinson 'poached' a goal just before half time and then made it 2-2 from the penalty spot early in the second half. A well taken goal from Brian Barlow and an own goal made the final score 3 all.

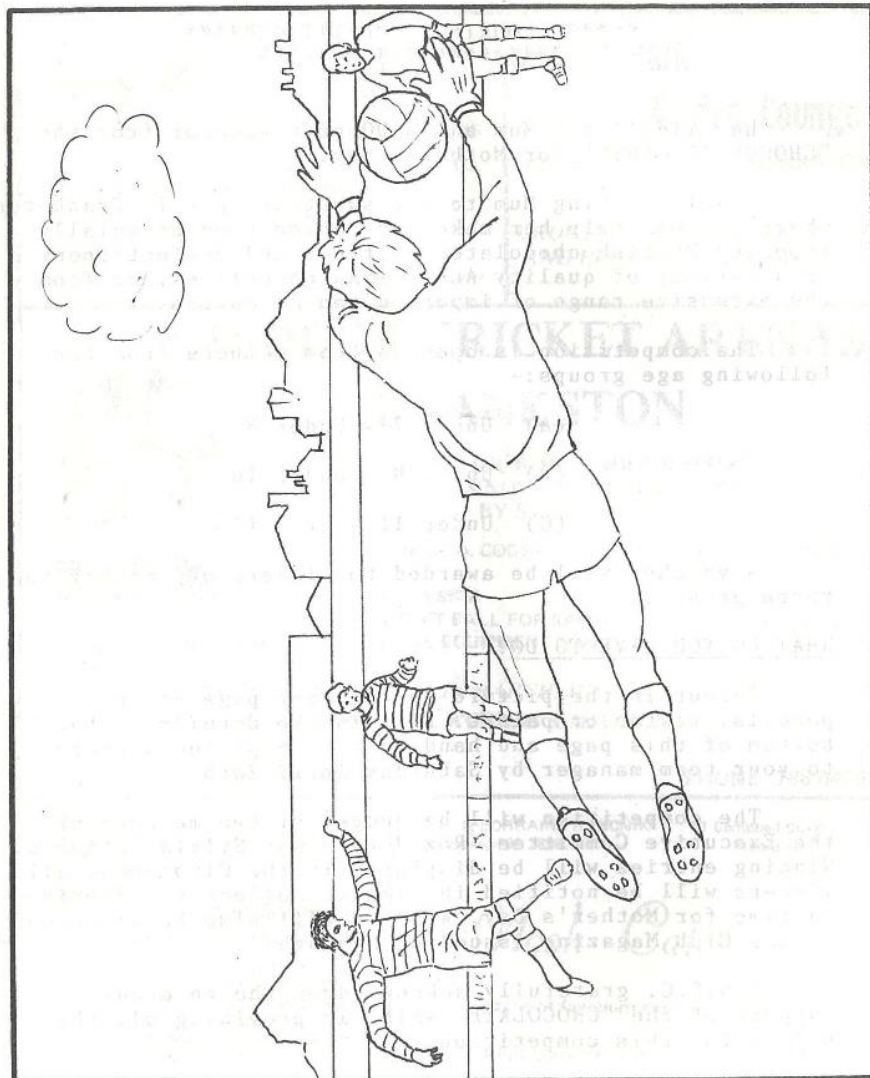
