This was our cup round and the boys played well keeping the opposition scoreless until after half-time. Thanks Chris Jones for helping out in goals.

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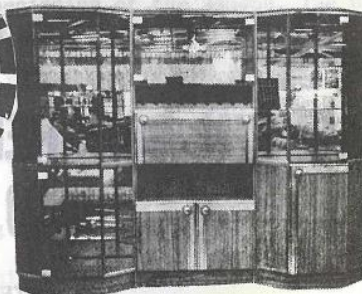
