Against a Hastings side that bunched and followed the ball like a swarm of flies our positional play was terrific. Ryan Carter relished

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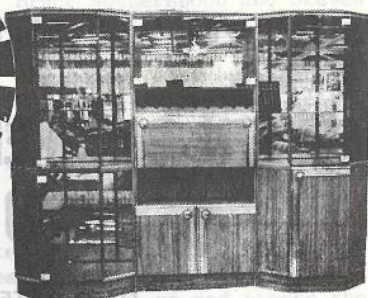
