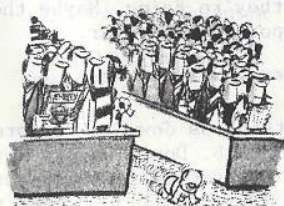

From time to time there is a certain amount of interest shown in the financial situation of the Club. Perhaps the following figures for 1985 will shed some light for those who are interested.

I have listed only a few of our major expenses but as you can see running a successful soccer club is a very expensive business. In fact, last year, we finished up with a loss of \$3500. It is therefore essential that in 1985 we correct that situation. This can be done in two ways, by keeping our expenditure to a bare minimum and by earning as much money as possible through the kiosk and bar and the remaining social functions planned and organised for the year.

The Executive Committee is continually concerned with keeping the expenditure to a minimum but, of course, must rely on the membership to give its fullest support if we are to raise the necessary funds. I would therefore urge all members, particularly the parents of our Junior players, get behind the Club by attending the Clubhouse on Thursday or Friday nights or by supporting all or any of the excellent social functions put on by our hard working Social Committee.

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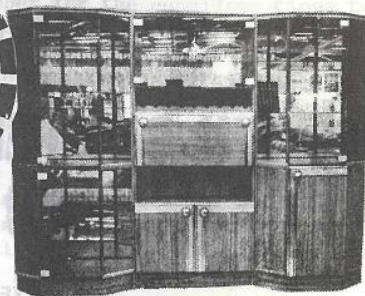


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JUNIOR ROUND-UP
