As we approach the end of the 1986 season, we can reflect upon our performances so far and of those to come. It is easy to say that had we turned some of our draws into wins we may have been somewhat higher in the league. Nine draws in a season is an exceptional amount and if you remember those games, there were many we should have won and indeed some we could have lost.

We have managed to score first on most occasions and the team that does this is normally to finish up winning. Conceding goals has been our downfall, with more than 1½ goals per game conceded over a season it is easy to see where the problems lie.

Weaknesses have been exposed, often accidentally, in the goalkeeping department, but these only account for a few. We play with a makeshift defence, made up of three players who prefer to play up front. Their wanderings promote attacking capability, but provide space for the opposition in attack and it is always more difficult to score goals than concede them if you provide the opposition with attacking space, exactly what they are looking for.

The ideal squad has plenty of both attacking and defensive players. This season for once, we have an abundance of attackers, some who are very good. We also have plenty of talented mid-fielders of varying talents.

Defensively we are light and that has been the most probable reason for us conceding so many goals this season.

Overall this year, we can be happy with our performances, if not the results. The players have provided us with many exciting games, particularly at home and have shown the flexibility of positions and talents. We have competed well against all teams, nobody has taken points from us too easily.

One of the main objectives this season was to get the club back to its original stature, this has been achieved.

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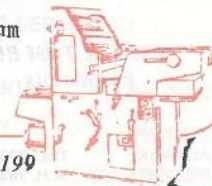
