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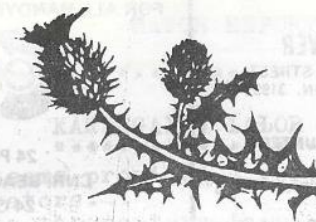
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MATCH REPORT

We hope to see you in the Club Rooms after the game for the "Player" award and the usual after match refreshments.

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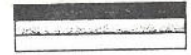
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JUNIOR DISCO
